The History of our Code of Conduct:

In 2004 the Code of Conduct was reviewed, and content of Codes of Conduct from neighbouring schools were considered. Through examination and use of the new Ministry guidelines, a draft copy of the new Code of Conduct was made. In 2005 the draft was presented to the School Planning Council for review and input, as well as considering the input from staff and the Parent Advisory Council. The draft was then revised to reflect such input.

Where you can find it

We publish our Code of Conduct in the students' agenda books. Students have a review of it each fall, during our first week of school, in a wide variety of learning activities. Our website also has our Code of Conduct on it. Notices for field trips also inform parents/guardians and students of the expectations for their conduct when out in the community.

Each student and parent is asked to read and review our Code of Conduct located in their student agenda. After reviewing it, each student and parent are asked to sign it to reflect that they have read and agreed to it. Expectations regarding acceptable conduct are made known to all students, parents, and school staff, including noon hour supervisors, and to temporary staff and visitors.

Teachers incorporate reinforcing the Code of Conduct into their classroom lessons, through classroom meetings, drama games, and stories. It is part of our social responsibility focus.

We do practice a proactive approach whereby we regularly try to celebrate the positive behavior that we see, rather than focusing on the negatives. Our goal is to continually further develop what we need, in order to maintain a safe, caring and orderly environment for our students. As Principal, I meet with the members of the School Planning Council Members and discuss the school goals, and pertinent details of the school's organization, composition and initiatives being undertaken by the school.

The Mundy Road Code of Conduct is in alignment with other schools within our local community of schools that feeds into our receiving middle schools. This helps us provide a smooth transition as students move on to the next level of their education. It is also in alignment with District Policy 17 (District Code of Conduct for Students), District Policy 18 (Violence, Intimidation and possession of Weapons) and District Administrative Procedure 355 (Suspension of Students).

Mundy Road Elementary School promotes the values expressed in the BC Human Rights Code respecting the rights of all individuals in accordance with the law – prohibiting discrimination based on race, colour, ancestry, plane of origin, religion, marital status, physical or mental disability, sex or sexual orientation – in respect of discriminatory publication and discrimination in accommodation, service and facility in the school environment.




