School Meetings


Current Topic: Garbage on the Playground!!

As I have mentioned previously we have school meetings each week on Wednesday mornings. During these meetings we talk about our current school-wide topic or focus. **Our current focus is about showing respect for our community by ensuring that our school grounds are kept free of litter.** This week I spoke about how when we leave our garbage on our playground our community begins to believe that we don't care about our school. We set a goal to reduce the amount of litter left behind on our playgrounds to as close to 0 as possible.

This week Mr. Wrights class collected garbage around our school and weighed it to see how much they found. They found 22 kilograms of garbage!! Some of the students from the class spoke about the types of garbage they were finding. Some spoke of coffee cups, firework remnants, and other items that would have been left by other people who use our grounds. Others spoke of granola bar wrappers, Ziploc bags, and other snack containers which would most likely be left behind by students at our school.

The garbage Mr. Wright's class collected provides us with some 'baseline-data'. For the next few weeks we will send a class out each week and we will continue to weigh what we find. We know we may not get to 0 as there is always some garbage left behind by others but we also know we can reduce this amount greatly as most of the garbage is left behind by members of our school community.

I am sharing this information with families so that you can continue this conversation with your child at home and when you are out. Encourage your child to notice garbage left behind when you are on outings so you can make a point of discussing how disappointing it is that some people just drop their garbage anywhere rather than finding a garbage bin or recycling it. These types of conversations will help your child develop awareness and will lead them to consider more carefully what they do with their garbage.
