Are You Moving?

It is really important as we work to determine our school organization for September that if you are planning on moving to a new school or district, you let us know as soon as possible. School Organization and Class Placement for September

Classroom placement for September is a process that begins soon. In this process we employ the best possible judgment in assigning each child to a class for September 2017. We work to balance each class in terms of grade level, gender, friendships and learning needs. If you have information that you would like us to consider, please inform Mrs. Strang in writing before the end of May. We ask that you refrain from making specific teacher requests but rather let us know the type of learning environment will best meet your child's needs.

Taking care of the Earth – Litterless Lunch initiative

Earth Day is on April 22nd. As a school we have been talking about things we can do to take better care of the Earth. Reducing the amount of Garbage we produce is one important way we can do this. Each of our classes is looking at how much garbage we create each day and looking for ways to reduce this. For this reason we are focusing this month on bringing "litterless lunches". Please assist your child in:

- Bringing food in reusable containers
- Bringing recyclables home so that they can be properly recycled
- Bringing uneaten food home so that conversations can be had in regards to eating enough
 and about why food that is sent is not being eaten if this is the case. If you find that your child
 is not eating properly at school please let your child's teacher know so that we can monitor
 their eating habits at school more closely.
