- There is a new General Manager of Parks and Rec in Coquitlam - currently working on updating/establishing joint usage agreements (City of Coquitlam - School District 43) - this is in the very early stages
- Road Safety an issue in Coquitlam
- $2.34 \%$ tax increase this year for Coquitlam
- $0.7 \%$ for new police officers to be dedicated solely to high crime areas so we can have our traffic officers dedicated to traffic enforcement
- Last year 734 traffic tickets issued in Coquitlam - 17 officers in traffic department however they were working on serious crime issues and did not spend enough time enforcing traffic issues
- What can we do as parents:
- Email City to report traffic safety issues (use "Mayor in Council" email) - your concerns will be forwarded to the RCMP
- If you are happy with the response you receive to your complaint communicate that as well
- Speak to School Board and School Trustees
- The more involved the community is the better
- Visit Public Safety tab on City of Coquitlam website
${ }^{* *}$ Communication is critical** - a communication plan is required to address our higher concern areas.
- Issues affecting Parkland:
- Poirier very short school zone
- Speak to School Board/District to find out:
- why it is where it is?
- Is there a way of lengthening it?
- Speak to School Trustees
- School Playground Usage Issues
- Send email outlining concerns to the "Mayor in Council" email and this will be shared with the Parks and Rec manager
- Traffic calming measures (curb bulges, round abouts, etc)
- Issues with snow removal
- Fire department doesn't like them height/trucks, etc
- Shift away from speed bumps and they don't work in all areas/on all roads - City wants traffic solutions that work in all areas across the city
- Traffic circles (round-abouts) - issues with street widths, street parking
- What about crossing guards for busier crosswalks?
- Speak to School Trustees
- Need to look at other jurisdictions around the globe for possible solutions
- Different colour crosswalks (bright green), other options to bring attention to the road, have people slow down
- Densification in Central Coquitlam
- City asking for Good Neighborhood Plans when builders seek permits to develop areas
