- 1. **Welcome:** Kim Parker
 - 1.1 Introductions
 - 1.2 Quorum established

 - 1.4 Chair Report
 - Wrapping up all programs, last hot lunch was today, KM Club finished and all trophies/ribbons ordered for the Tues. June 28 KM Club assembly
- 2. Principal's Report: Anita Strang
 - Parkland detailed school calendar was distributed –won't be post on the website until all dates are confirmed
 - Next school year will be combining/blending the celebration of learning assemblies with the weekly Wednesday school meetings
 - Working on action plan for learning (advised by the district that the School Planning Committees will no longer be in place)
 - Parkland Goals will be similar to this past year
 - Continue with classroom community circles and focus on social emotional learning
 - Next year will continue with the school wide meetings will expand the classroom community circles to multi age groupings similar to the sports day multi age groupings.
 - School and classroom charters are actively being to foster various conversations
 - "Mind Up Program" Parkland teachers to take the training
 - Focus on out of control behaviors –to coach kids how to control their behaviors – teach the children how their brain works – Sept Pro-D day will be this training for all Parkland teachers
 - On-line survey closes tonight and this year's information is important as last year was just to collect baseline data. This year's data will be used to compare to last year's baseline data
- 3. **Sole Girls Afterschool Program** presentation 7pm recommended by Darlene Hunter (Ashley)
 - Running at a few schools in Coquitlam 12 locations in lower mainland (schools, MEC, etc)

- Started in 2013
- Focus sessions on being inclusive and feeling good about ourselves
 - Many children dealing with mental health issues (ie. Anxiety levels are at an all time high)
 - Teach girls to be an inclusive friend
 - Focus on being physically active and increasing physical awareness
- Video shown
- 8-12 year old girls
- Connect girls with girls be who you are
- Encouraging building confidence not competitiveness
- Just began a Sole Boys in Jan. 2016
- 9 week curriculum ½ program indoors and ½ program outdoors
 - Begin session discussing values, goals, body image and then second half of session move into physical activity based on topic discussed earlier – do a workbook – promote your "happy pace"
 - Program is training to learn to run a 5km fun run
 - 1 hour and 45 min/once a week
 - Sessions run three times a year year round and do summer camps
 - \$280 per child school program cost is usually reduced
 - 4:1 trainer/student ratio
 - minimum 7 participants to max of 15
 - Typically grade 3-5 can reach out to grade 2-5 group
 - Trainers do a follow up with parents after each session so the parents know what topics were covered during the session and provide some speaking points to foster the conversation at home.
- Mentors are carefully chosen and trained
- Now booking for fall
