Principal's Message

Dear Pinetree Families:



It is hard to believe we are already starting December. Students are over half way through their semester one classes. In Novem-

ber we sent home our first formal report card and followed them up with our Parent Teacher interviews. This was an opportunity for parents to discuss their child's progress with their teachers. We were very pleased with the number of parents who took advantage of the opportunity to communicate with their child's teacher. As we head towards the end of the semester we encourage all parents to keep the lines of communication open with their child and their child's teachers through the last two months of semester one. With November ending we want to congratulate all of our fall athletes. All of our teams had very successful seasons. A special congratulation to Pinetree's Cross Country team for winning a 5th straight District Championship. Our senior boys' soccer team made it the Fraser Valley Championships this year and Pinetree's grade 9 girls' volleyball team made it to the Provincial Championships and finished in ninth place. Pinetree's E-sports team is off to a very successful start to the season winning their first four matches.

In November we had a number of our students attending and contributing to this year's Holocaust Symposium.

December is a busy month at Pinetree with classes going until December 21st. During the month of December Pinetree will be participating in a food drive to help families in our community. COURSE PLANNING FOR 2019 - 2020 SCHOOL YEAR

Even though we are only just approaching the half way point of this school year we are already starting the process of course selection for the 2019-2010 school year. **Grade 9—11 students will attend presentations from counsellors in early February and March.** Course selection is a very important process for students and the school. The choices that students make drive the building of our timetable for the next school year; therefore, we need students and parents to make informed choices about course selection. We encourage parents and students to research in advance post-secondary requirements before the course selection process. We have a Parent information night planned for Thursday January 24th to talk about the Graduation program and postsecondary requirements. In May students will be given the opportunity to review their course selections and let **us know if there are errors.** After this check in May we have <u>limited</u> ability to make changes. This means in September of 2019, we cannot have students coming to us asking for course changes.

Thank you for your understanding and helping your child make positive course selection decisions. This helps us build the best possible timetable for our entire school community.

COUNSELLING CONNECTIONS

Mental Wellness - What does it mean?

We would like to create connections with our Pinetree community and encourage parents to create dialogue about mental wellness with their children. It is an opportunity to be proactive in making time and space to take care of our own mental health and recognize ways to support others. Here are two books that we recommend:

Mindset: The New Psychology of Success by Carol S. Dweck

How does a fixed mindset serve you? The belief that skills, intellect, and talents are set and unchangeable. Would you like to learn about ways to think differently? In her book, Carol S. Dweck discusses the growth mindset: the belief that skills, intellect, and talents can be developed through **practice** and **perseverance**. Read and learn how you and your child can apply a growth mindset to your life.

Brainstorm by Dan Siegel

Brainstorm is an informative and easy-to-read book on helping parents understand the teenage mind and what changes take place developmentally during those years. The book discusses why this period is important in a child's life and offers helpful strategies on navigating this time through conversations and practices to shift negative perspectives.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR GRADUATING STUDENTS

Students intending on pursuing a post-secondary program beginning Sept. 2019 must register for a BC Government account, a **BCeID** to access the **Student Transcript Service (STS)**. This service is an online application that allows students to access their official transcripts, certificates, scholarship information, course assessment and examination marks. Students can also order and electronically send transcripts to post-secondary institutions. This process ensures that official transcripts are sent to post-secondary institutions. Students at Pinetree will have an opportunity to sign-up and register for the STS during PACK on Wednesday, Nov. 28. Please verify that your son or daughter has completed this process.

To sign-up for a BCeID and register/activate the Student Transcript Service, students must visit the following link: http://www.studenttranscripts.gov.bc.ca

In addition, universities require students to report 'unofficial' grades by 'self-reporting' or 'uploading' a transcript via their university student account or send a transcript by email through a school official or directly by the student. This reporting of grades is necessary for a student to receive a 'conditional' offer of admission. Grades will be verified by the university when official grades are received electronically from the BC Government via the STS.

DEVICE USE DURING CLASS TIME

In order to have student focus remain on education during class time, we are asking them to abide by the following guidelines:

- During class time devices should be for educational purposes only. That is, students should not be using their phones to watch movies, text, receive calls, etc. Students can place their phone upside down on their desk, in their jacket, or in their backpack.
- If students need to use the washroom, we ask that they leave their phones behind. A student can leave it in their backpack, place it on the teacher's desk, whatever they choose.
- Students should not have earbuds in when class is engaged in a lesson.

If students do not adhere to these guidelines, a teacher may ask them for their phone/device. If a student refuses to do this, the teacher may refer them to the appropriate administrator. We are asking parents/guardians to only contact their children on their off block or at lunch. If there is a family emergency, please contact the school office so we can provide support to your child.



BASKETBALL

After a successful 2017-18 season Pinetree's basketball program has set some high goals and expectations for the 2018-19 season. Our players at all three levels -Grade 9, Juniors and Seniors - are very eager to compete with the hope of an enjoyable season.



The teams are training four times a week and have already faced several competitive oppo-

nents that are provincially ranked. Our basketball teams will enter their season by hosting Pinetree's Christmas Classic at all three levels - Grade 9, Junior and Senior levels. We will be competing against top teams in the province of British Columbia. Our junior boys tournament has two provincially ranked opponents in the pre-season while our senior boys tournament boasts six provincially ranked teams as well as visiting teams from Calgary, Victoria, Kelowna and Prince George. The Pinetree Christmas Classic series is also a great stage for many students at our school. We have countless volunteers who help us set up this event -from students who drew the posters welcoming the visiting teams, scorekeepers and event runners, the marching band from our music department to game directors and concession stand operators. The grade 9 boys tournament runs Monday to Thursday (December 3rd to 6th) while the junior boys tournament begins on Monday and ends on Wednesday (December 10th to 12th). The senior boys tournament runs from Monday to Tuesday (December 17th to 18th) and it is free of charge to attend.
