Principal's Message

I am excited about the start of the new school year and all the exciting possibilities that a new year brings. Hopefully, families have had a wonderful summer break and students are recharged and ready to start another school year. Pinetree and Pinetree Community Centre have had extensive work done on the building this summer. We are excited about the upgrades in our gym, the painting of the exterior of the building and the interior lighting upgrades. With this parents and students may find that there are still some contractors working in and around the building as we start the new year. We are looking forward to welcoming back our returning students and we know our new students will be accepted and embraced into the Pinetree family.

SCHOOL START UP

The first day of school this year is Tuesday September 3rd. Students attend "PACK" (homeroom) on the 3rd. Grade 9 students attend from 9:00 am until 12:00 pm for their digital boot camp. Grade 9 students should bring their digital device (laptop or tablet) to this session. Those families who need assistance with providing their child a device should contact Mr. Martin at the school. Our Grade 10 and 11 students attend PACK at 10:00 am on September 3rd for about 45 minutes. Grade 12 students attend PACK at 11:00 am on September 3rd for about forty-five minutes. In a change from years past, all students will have their photos taken on Thursday, September 5th. All students are expected to have their photo taken for our school records, student identification cards and the school yearbook. Families are also able to purchase these photos from Artona - our photo provider. Our school yearbook is a colour history of the school year. It includes photos of all students by grade and many activities that happen over the course of the year.

An APP and E- FORM to keep us connected!

Please check our updated Pinetree website often for information about what is happening at the school. The Pinetree school app can be downloaded from the Apple App store and Google Play store. It is called Myschoolday app for your smart phone. Once it is downloaded you will be asked to select a region (B.C.) then a school district (Coquitlam #43) and finally our school (Pinetree). You only need to do this once. The app is a great way to keep up to date on what is happening at the school.

In the past, we have used an automatic phone/email messaging system (Synervoice) to notify families regarding student daily attendance and important events and dates. The school district is looking to have a vendor selected soon that meets Canadian privacy standards and that helps with the communication of student attend-

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is very important for student success at secondary school. We expect all students to be in attendance on a daily basis and ask that parents work in partnership with us to make sure that students are at school on time ready to learn. With the focus on attendance being so important for student success, we request that families do not plan early holidays during the school year. Extended holidays attached to Winter Break and Spring Break can affect students' ability to achieve their full potential. Thank you in advance for supporting our Staff as they work to give your child the best possible learning experience.

SAFETY and SECURITY

There are incidents of theft in every community. Pinetree Secondary is a community of over 1500 students that, at times, must deal with theft. As a school, we educate students to be responsible for their personal belongings and those learning materials issued by the school. The safest place and best plan is for students to secure items in their lockers in the A or B wing or if they are very valuable, keep them at home! **Students should not leave any valuables in the boys or girls change room lockers near the gym. Students should not leave any valuables unattended in classrooms, hallways or washrooms.** Students should never share locker combinations or lockers. The school cannot take responsibility for students' personal belongings, but we do care and will try and assist with lost property whenever possible.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

We are very lucky at Pinetree to have a great campus that allows our students access to both the Community Centre and Douglas College. All three areas do not allow any smoking or vaping anywhere on our properties. To continue to have a great relationship with our partners we are asking students to remember that we are visitors in these areas. Our neighbours at Douglas College have asked us to remind our students that students can order food at Douglas and eat quickly and then return to Pinetree. The Douglas College Cafeteria is not an area that our students should be hanging out in during their off block. It is only for students that have purchased food at Douglas. Our students should not be using it as a study area or an area to socialize. If students are hanging out or studying in the Douglas College Cafeteria, they will be asked to leave by Pinetree Administration or Douglas College Security. This year, as we have done for the last several years, we are having our incoming grade 9s on Campus for the month of September. This means that all grade nine students must not go over to Douglas College for the month of September as they acclimatize to life at high school. We thank all of our students in helping us keep a positive relationship with our community partners.

COURSE and SCHEDULE CHANGES

Course selection is a process that begins with students in the spring of every school year. We ask students and parents to make informed choices around courses for the upcoming school year. This allows the school to plan and organize a timetable for the school based on student choice.

In June we sent a message home to all families of students going into Grade 10-12 about the limited ability of the school to make course changes. Students had the opportunity in June to do an online course request change form. The Counsellors and Administration reviewed all requests and, where possible, tried to accommodate requests. We will not be entertaining course changes as we start the new school year. Counsellors have access to all summer school results and will be making adjustments if needed because of summer school. Parents and students should not be contacting counsellors about schedules and course changes. Counsellors will only be working on developing schedules for new students and will not be answering emails from parents and students of returning students that pertain to schedules and course changes. We have had to make minor adjustments to our timetable over the summer and ALL students will receive a finalized copy of their schedule on September 3rd.

NEW BEGINNINGS

Over the summer, Pinetree had an addition to our administration team. I would like to welcome Mr. Chris Martin to Pinetree. I know he is looking forward to meeting students and parents as we start another school year. We hope all of our students will set high expectations for themselves and reach for their dreams. We are looking forward to working with all of our students and families during the 2019-2020 school year.

I encourage all parents to stay involved in their child's school even as they start high school. Pinetree's Parent Advisory Council (PAC) meets throughout the school year. We hope to see you at the first PAC meeting on September 17th at 7:00 pm in the school library. In early October the Pinetree After Grad Committee will have its first meeting. (Date still to be determined). Parent involvement at the high school level is as important as ever and we encourage parents to participate in these meetings.

PARENT CONNECTION

Attendance

O ther than the academic lessons students learn at Pinetree, attitudes toward prompt and regular attendance at school and work are among the most important lessons we teach students. Please help us teach your son or daughter healthy attitudes towards school and the workplace by:

Phoning the school each day your son or daughter is going to be absent or late. Even if your son or daughter may insist that you needn't call, please do. We need to hear before the absence occurs whenever possible. Our switchboard is open daily at 7:30 a.m. Please call! We also have an answering machine for calls outside of office hours.

Minimizing the number of reasons for absence. We believe illness to be the only acceptable reason for missing school or work. Please arrange appointments, vacations and driving tests around school hours.

Knowing your son/daughter's timetable. With our extended day organization, it will be less straightforward than usual as to when your son or daughter starts or finishes on certain days. It is worth the time it will take you to understand his or her schedule. Attend the "Meet the Teacher" evening, **September 26, 2019** — it will help you understand our schedule!

Contact the teacher. If you are concerned about attendance, in a specific class or in general, please contact your son or daughter's teacher or counsellor as soon as possible.

Stressing promptness. Being on time shows respect for the activity and consideration for others.

When each of us is occasionally, unavoidably late, it is our responsibility to:

•hurry in order to be less late

•apologize on arrival for disrupting class

•accept personal responsibility for being late.

Drop-off/Pick-up Safety for Our Students

In order to ensure the safety of ALL students during drop-off and pick-up times, and to respect the Staff and Patrons of the Community Recreation Centre, *Parents/Guardians are asked to please NOT enter the Community Recreation Centre's parking lot.* Instead, Parents/Guardians may use one of the following options:

Drivers must use the marked yellow zone beside the Staff Parking Lot located off of Pinewood Avenue (across from the Fire Hall). To drop off and pick up your students in a safe and legal manner, please drive as far along the marked drop-off area as possible before stopping. DO NOT use the staff parking lot. Once students have safely exited the vehicle, drivers MUST continue to drive forward and exit to Pinetree Way (via the Recreation Centre or Douglas College Exits). This is the only way to keep this zone safe for all students and keep traffic moving in this area.

Or

Drivers are permitted to use Lot A located in the Town Centre Parking Area. Lot A is at the end of the Student Overpass. Parents/Guardians may drop students off at the bottom of the stairs of the Student Overpass. The School's entrance doors are located right at the other end of the Student Overpass. We suggest you have your child meet you after school at the stairs of the Student Overpass in Lot A.

In order to decrease traffic congestion and improve Student safety, families should encourage students to walk to school whenever possible
