This year, the society is kicking off a campaign to spread awareness on the issue by selling fuchsia-colored daisy pins. The symbol was chosen as a visual way to represent various facets of the issue; daisies represent childhood innocence and fuchsia is a combination of red, for red light districts, and purple, the provincial colour for violence prevention.
