DOGS ON PORTER SCHOOL PROPERTY

We recognize and appreciate that dogs are significant and loved members of some of our families and that parents and caregivers, often walk or bring their dog to school when dropping-off their child at the start of the school day and when picking up their child at the end of the school day.

Several weeks ago, a parent reported that before school a dog defecated on our school grounds; the extremely disturbing part was that the dog-dropping was not cleaned up by the owner. The owner is believed to be a school parent. This report was made after the 8:50 am school bell; upon being reported to us our Caretaker and I cleaned up the dropping and disposed of it. The owner and dog had left.

On another occasion last week before school a parent reported that a dog was running on our gravel field off leash.

Dog feces can transmit disease – PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG!

Please remember and be mindful that some of our students and adults are scared of dogs; that not all of our school community members are comfortable with dogs – PLEASE KEEP YOUR DOG ON A LEASH AND IN CONTROL AT ALL TIMES!

EVEN LOUD DOG-BARKING CAN SCARE SOME STUDENTS AND ADULTS – if you own such a vocal dog please keep your dog a safe distance from our students, undercover areas, especially our adventure play areas.

Therefore, please, when dropping off and picking up your child:

- ♦ Other than school drop-off and school pick-up of students, dogs are not to be on school property
- ALL dogs MUST be leashed AT ALL TIMES and under the direct control of the owner
- ◆ DO NOT tie up your dog and leave unattended at any time
- ALL dogs MUST remain outside the school
- ♦ Dogs and their owners MUST NOT block entrances to and exits from our school
- Please keep your dog well away from our school entrances/exits
- ♦ Please keep your dog well away from our school playgrounds
- ♦ DO NOT wait with your dog on or next to paths where students enter and exit our school property
- ♦ Dogs should NEVER be off-leash
- ♦ Dog owners MUST clean up their dog's feces and any residue
- ♦ Please report any concerns to the office

While it is difficult for school staff to supervise school property usage during the evenings and weekends, the City of Coquitlam Bylaw Office has been contacted to help monitor school grounds during these times.

The staff at Porter Elementary School is working hard to ensure a safe and caring school environment and with your cooperation we hope to continue to work with all of our community members.

If someone is caught breaking one or more of the rules above and we can identify the owner we will forward names and details to both the RCMP and City of Coquitlam Bylaws Department.

You risk being fined.

NEW DOG SIGNAGE

Through the combined efforts of SD43 Coquitlam and the City of Coquitlam a pilot dog signage program has been implemented at both Parkland Elementary and Porter Elementary Schools.

The purpose of the signage is meant to articulate and clarify both City of Coquitlam Animal *Care and Control Bylaw* and SD43 Coquitlam and City of Coquitlam expectations with respect to dogs on school grounds during school hours and after school hours.

The signage was installed, over Spring Break, on our perimeter fencing along both MacIntosh St and Grover Ave. In addition, we had signage put up along several points at the front of our school along Porter St.

The signage looks like:

Students/Children Play Here

NO DOGS ALLOWED on school district property during school days from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. with the exception of:

- Assistance dogs.
- Dogs with a parent/guardian during student drop-off and pick-up.

AT ALL TIMES, ALL DOGS ON SCHOOL PROPERTY MUST BE:

- Licensed.
- Cleaned up after and have their waste removed.
- Leashed and under adult control.*
- Kept away from buildings, entrances and play areas.*



* Assistance dogs exempt.

Thank you for following these rules and supporting a respectful environment.



Individuals must adhere to City of Coquitlam Animal Care and Control Bylaw 4240, 2011 Section 10.7

Every owner of an animal, other than a special needs assistance animal, while in a public place must obey all posted signs that apply to that animal, including, without limitation, all signs restricting or prohibiting entry by dogs onto private property.

Failure to adhere to posted signs could result in fines.


