PARKING AND ENTRANCES: Please review the map below indicating the drop off / pick up area for parents (lower lot unless previously arranged upper area drop off). Students please access the door relating to the floor of your classroom.

We currently have 3 entrances / exits with wash stations and/or hand sanitizer. Students are to use these three doors:

Door 1 = lower 100 level classrooms and shops

Door 2 = main floor 200 level classrooms and office

MEMO FROM THE CITY OF PORT MOODY: TRAFFIC PATTERN NOTIFICATION

On **September 28, 2020**, the City will introduce temporary slow zones on St. George Street from Albert Street to Elgin Street, Kyle Street to Grant Street, and Hugh Street to Buller Street. Access will be limited to local traffic and barricades will be set up at six intersections to prevent traffic from entering.

Local traffic will still be able to exit St. George Street at all intersections and restrictions will not apply to pedestrians or cyclists. These slow zones will help to reduce traffic volumes and traffic speed while prioritizing walking, cycling, and other active or neighbourhood uses.
