A reminder to our returning students that we will not be scheduling appointments for course changes in late August / September. #### **Bell Schedule**

In general, our school day starts at 8:30am Monday to Friday (some IB students have a block 0 start time). Last year we added a Flex block to our weekly schedule and Flex is recognized instructional time (Tuesday to Friday starting at 8:30am) when students have the opportunity to engage in their learning in more self-directed ways. During Flex students: seek assistance from their teachers; collaborate with other students; conduct club and student council meetings; get organized for the day; pursue enrichment opportunities; make up missed time due to absence; develop work habits and life skills of time management, ownership of their learning, choice, and independence.

While the majority of students appreciate having ownership of this time to get organized and initiate their learning, we do get asked by some, "Do I <u>have</u> to be here for Flex?" Our answer is simply, "Yes, the school day starts at 8:30."

Monday's have the same start time but please note the end of day is different from the rest of the week. In addition to Flex we have created a weekly time for staff collaboration. At our parent night, student orientations, and to our grade 9s during start up assemblies and homerooms, we will explain in greater detail the schedule and the benefits to teaching and learning in having Flex and collaboration time.

Our regular weekly bell schedule is below. During the year, some grade-level and school-wide events will impact our regular schedule, but in most of those situations the start and end time of the day will remain consistent. When required, our amended schedules will be posted in advance to our daily news, website and within the building.

Our main office is generally open 8:00am – 4:00pm (amended hours on: holidays, professional development days, summer). In addition to our daily news, our most common means of sharing school wide information is the website, app and automated messaging system *School Messenger*. In order to receive *School Messenger* information and our daily news we require your contact information and approval by indicating 'yes' on the parent school policy form. If during the year you wish to have your email removed or updated, please contact the office. Our app is available for download at the App Store by searching: *My School Day* and selecting Moody Secondary School.

Our staff directory with email addresses is located on our website under the Staff tab (and also viewable on our app). For communication we ask you first contact your child's teacher(s) should you have a need, issue or question relating to a specific class.

Parents/Guardians are asked to contact the school to report if their child is going to be absent, late or will require an early dismissal. ### **School Supplies**

Teachers will indicate any course specific materials when introducing the course syllabus at the start of the semester. In general, the regular supplies of binders, paper, pens/pencils, dividers, and a calculator are sufficient. While we are not officially a bring your own device (BYOD) school, students are strongly encouraged to use personal laptops. Proper PE strip is required for those students in a PE course. All students will have the opportunity to request a locker and lock during the first week of homeroom.

### Moved / Moving?

If you have moved out of the area over the summer and will not be attending Port Moody Secondary, please contact the office as soon as possible and we can assist you with your timely registration at your new school.

### Students not in attendance the week of Tuesday, September 3rd

If your child will be away at the start of the school year for a known reason, then please contact the office and indicate the start date for your child. Students absent without notice for the entire first week of school may have their courses removed with the assumption you are no longer residing in the PMSS catchment.

The grade 9 / new student orientation on August 29<sup>th</sup> is meant as a support and is not considered a required event to attend. We recognize families have other commitments in the last week of summer however, we encourage students to attend as it allows some focused time for new students to see the building, interact with our leadership students, and ask specific questions ahead of the first day of school.

#### **Parent Forms & Fees**

During the last week of August the updated 2019.20 online start of year forms (required & optional) will be accessible on our homepage under Quick Links > Parent eForms. Paper copies will also be made available to students during the first week. We request all forms be submitted by Thursday, September 12<sup>th</sup>.

Student fee statements will also be posted when school starts and can be paid online using the district School Cash Online system at <a href="https://sd43.schoolcashonline.com">https://sd43.schoolcashonline.com</a>. This is the district's preferred method of payment. Cash and cheque is also accepted and envelopes for payment submission will be issued during the first week. Grad related fees for our grade 12s will be posted later in the year. No student will be denied educational opportunities offered at the school due to financial hardship and if need arises please contact one of the Vice Principals.

#### **Transcripts, June Report Cards**

End of year report cards (all grades) are still available for pick up in the office. The Ministry of Education's transcript information for grade 12s is accessible <u>HERE</u>.

#### **Port Moody Parent Advisory Council**

### **Digital Learning News!**

All Grade 9 students will be taking Applications of Digital Learning 10 over the course of the 2019-2020 school year. Applications of Digital Learning 10 facilitates students to effectively and ethically consume and create a wide variety of digital content, including blogs, documents, images, social media posts, video, and podcasts. Communication is a central theme of the course and students will demonstrate a willingness and ability to appropriately express and exchange information, experiences, and ideas using various digital tools. Students will be informed of assemblies and Flex meetings through MySchoolDay App on the Digital Learning channel and the School Announcements.

### Here's what one student had to say:

Digital Learning (DL) is a course that allows you to reflect on how you use technology, your impact on the online world, and the real-world effect of that impact through several personal responses over the duration of the year. These responses will allow you to familiarize yourself with online tools such as Edublogs and PowerPoint, as well as applying technology in some of your core classes (Math, Science, English, and Socials). The main point of DL is to spread awareness about being a responsible online citizen, as well as to let you figure out how you want to present yourself online.

### **B.C. Graduation Program**

Some key changes to note on the final implementation steps of the graduation program:

- The new Grade 10 Graduation Literacy Assessment will be introduced in 2019/20
- The new Grade 12 Graduation Literacy Assessment will be introduced in 2020/21
- The English 12 provincial exam is no longer required for graduation. Students who graduated in the 2018/19 school year did not write a literacy assessment. They were the final grade to write the course-based Language Arts 12 provincial exam.
- The Grade 10 Graduation Numeracy Assessment was introduced in 2018.
- Numeracy and Literacy Assessment scoring is based on a 4 point performance scale. Scores are/will be displayed on a transcript separate and independent from any subject mark.

### **Provincial Graduation Assessments**

Students need to write the following graduation assessments in order to graduate:

- Numeracy Assessment
- Literacy Assessments

You must write each assessment at least once, and you have two opportunities to rewrite each assessment. You can write the numeracy assessment this year, but will only be able to write the literacy assessment starting January 2020. You will learn more about these assessments during the school year. If you have any questions, talk to your school counsellor.

### **Buses, Traffic & Parking**

Albert Street and the surrounding streets are very congested in the mornings and after school. How we individually respond to this fact influences how we all start our day, and most importantly, affects the safety of the students and staff at school. Definitely anticipate leaving yourself extra time the first week back as the general community adjusts to more volume on the roads after Labour Day. On a daily basis resolve to work together by considering others and respecting designated parking areas. The staff parking lot and laneway after the Port Moody sign is not a drop off / pick up location. Consider establishing a regular spot that is within walking distance of the school, yet considerate of our neighbour's ability to get in and out of their homes. We appreciate how congested the area is and notice it only increasing what with the volume of cars, housing construction and most recently the

closed roadways such as Como Lake and Gatensbury Rd. Vehicle congestion and the related poor driving habits around schools is increasingly an issue at all levels and we thank you in advance for your cooperation.

#### Drivers:

- Drop off / pick up is at the lower roundabout at the entrance to the student parking lot (highlighted in yellow below)
- In the mornings move towards the curbside of Albert so that staff and district vehicles can drive up Albert Street.
- Above the school sign (highlighted in red) is parking for staff, preapproved families and emergency vehicles only.

#### Pedestrians:

- Be considerate to the flow of traffic by walking around the drop off area rather than across it
- Be safe and aware of your surroundings. We see too many of you talking to one another or staring at your screen as you step off curbs into traffic.
