A study on bullying by the University of British Columbia, based on 490 students (half female, half male) in Grades 8-10 in a BC City in the winter of 1999, showed:

- 64% of kids had been bullied at school
- 40% tried to intervene
- 12% were bullied regularly (once or more a week)
- 64% considered bullying a normal part of school life

Bullying is not a normal part of life. **Bullying hurts everyone!**



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
