Scholarship Details:

Karin Khuong loved life, family, school and sports but basketball was her passion. She began playing at Castle Park Elementary, where she earned the nickname 2K, and later for club teams in PoCo Galaxy and VK Basketball. Karin was diagnosed with stage 4 rhabdomyosarcoma (RMS), a softtissue childhood cancer, in Sept. 2018. The community rallied around her and she held off the disease long enough to return to practice and play in games for Terry Fox Secondary. Karin Khuong passed away on October 4th, 2020 at 16 years old.
