GRADUATION EVENTS

Graduation season is upon us! The class of 2018 is excitedly awaiting their Dinner/Dance and the G18 Student Group has been hard at work ensuring that it's a successful evening for all. Your work is appreciated!

We have met with our grade 12s recently to share our expectations for the remainder of the year. Our message is simple...take this time to thank the people who have been a significant part of your lives and end your school year on a positive note. Parents, we are asking for your support in continuing to encourage your children to persevere and maintain their focus through to the end of the school year. Students must be passing all their courses in order to attend their graduation activities and many students have post-secondary admissions and scholarships being contingent on their final grades.

On a more serious note, we reminded our grade 12s that the graduation events are school events and are expected to be alcohol and drug free. Students who attend these events in possession or having consumed these substances will not be permitted to enter these events. Parents, we recognize that graduation is a wonderful accomplishment for your child and that some of you will be gathering together with family and friends prior to your child leaving to attend dinner and dance and/or After Grad. In the past, we have had some parents choose to provide alcohol to their children to celebrate their graduation as part of their celebration before departing home for Dinner and Dance. Unfortunately, once these children arrived at their graduation activities, they were not permitted to enter. Our objective is to provide a safe environment for your children. Please help us by reminding your children that the graduation activities are enjoyable and memorable, and that they do not require alcohol or drugs to have a good time.

GRADUATION EVENTS Continued...

Lastly, please be aware of district and school policy regarding grad pranks. We have been very fortunate in that our grads over the past several years have been very respectful of our school community. We would like to maintain this tradition. Just a reminder that any students who vandalize the school, negatively impact the learning environment, harm animals, or jeopardize the safety of our students and staff will forfeit their graduation events. Furthermore, any vandalism to the school will be reported to the police for investigation and criminal charges. Please have a conversation with your children about the impact these actions could have on their graduation, their future, and on their family.

INFORMATION ABOUT NEXT YEAR'S SCHEDULE

Last year, the Supreme Court of Canada made a decision pertaining to the sizes and composition of classes in BC schools. Those changes were outlined in Riverside's May 2017 newsletter. This year, we continue with the same system in effect, and are creating classes for next year that are compliant with the regulations. All our classrooms will be used throughout the day. With our enrolment numbers roughly unchanged, we anticipate the need for a certain number of Block 1 (7:45am) classes. It is possible that your child will be assigned to one of those classes. Students with a block 1 class have the option to have a study block later in the day. Current students will receive their 2018/2019 timetable during the RAP on June 1st.

COURSE CHANGE PROCESS

We are changing our process for students wanting to make changes to their timetable. In the past, students requiring course changes would schedule an appointment with their counsellor in the first week of school in September. However, given the new class size and composition requirements, we must do our best to ensure that classes are not in violation. In order for us to do this, we will need to track every course change a student makes so that it does not put a class in violation. In other words, if a student wants to switch a class, but by doing so, that change makes the class go over on size or composition, we will not be able to accommodate that request.

Therefore, the new process for course changes will be as follows:

>Students will receive their 2018/2019 timetable early June

>Students seeking a course change must submit a course change request at

https://tinyurl.com/ybprvzzy from June 4th - June 8th.

The counselling and administrative team will meet on June 11th to address each request while attempting to maintain the appropriate class size and composition. Once course changes are completed, no further changes will be made. Once counsellors have completed course changes, they will email an updated schedule back to the students at their school district email account.

Course changes in September will only be made for extenuating circumstances (eg. change in course request due to summer school). However, NO course changes will be made for the following reasons:

>Wanting a class in a different block

>Wanting a different elective

>Wanting a different teacher

>Wanting a class with a friend

>Wanting a study block at a different time

SUMMER SCHOOL COURSES

Riverside students planning on registering for summer school must meet with their counsellor prior to registration to discuss their course plans. If taking a summer school course involves a course change for next year, you must check to make sure there is room in the new course. Counsellors will assist students in making course choices that meet their educational goals and plans. Once this process is complete, students may proceed with creating a new account or updating an old one with Summer Learning prior to registration.

Note: On-line registration for Grade 9 and 10 remedial courses and EAL summer school courses will take place in May. Counsellors generally wait for final June marks before recommending remedial summer school courses or EAL courses. Contact the counsellor for further information.

COMMENCEMENT COMMENTS

There are still a number of grade 12 students who have not provided a comment to be read at Commencement. Students should meet with their counsellor asap to take care of this.

SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

Each year at Commencement, the scholarship and bursary awards won by your son or daughter are read out as he or she crosses the stage. If your child has won a scholarship or bursary please inform Mrs. Chittenden as soon as possible so that appropriate recognition is made.



- The Provincial Numeracy Exam is mandatory for graduation for grade 10 and 11 students presently registered in Math 10 or 11 (Semester 2) who have
 not previously written a Math 10 Provincial exam. Please check the schedule below to find which day you will be writing the numeracy exam and in
 which classroom (organized by last name). Online calculators are provided on the electronic section of the numeracy exam.
- Students should bring picture ID to any provincial examination.
- Please note that students may not begin provincial exams any later than 30 minutes after the official start time.
- Grade 12 Transitions exit Interviews (for all English 12 students who have not done them) will be held in RAP classrooms.


