- •You must take a French Immersion Social Studies course in grade 11 or 12 (Histoire 12 or Culture Comparees 12)

Grade 11 English Options

Students pick 1 English 11 course from the following 2 options:

- English First Peoples: Literary Studies and Writing 11
- English First Peoples: Literary Studies and Writing 11 Honours (Online Application)

Both courses satisfy the English 11 requirement and teach reading, writing and speaking skills.



This mandatory course is required for graduation, and is intended to help prepare you for career-related aspects of your life after high school

In the second half of Grade 11, you will be added to a CLC TEAMS class. Make sure you check your school email and CLC Team regularly. TEAMS is the primary platform for this course.

CAPSTONE- You will get to design a project that combines what you like to do and what will help you for your future




CAPSTONE- It can be directly towards your future career path (if you know what it is), or to develop a skill set that will benefit you after high school.



How to Apply

- Fill out an online Science Coop application during grade 11 course selection
- When selecting courses, please select Pre-calculus 11, Chemistry 11, Physics 11 and an ELECTIVE.
- Successful applicants will be scheduled appropriately by their counsellor and the lowest priority elective will be changed to Coop Work Experience 12A
- Opportunity for a 3-day retreat (associated cost of approximately \$325)

Regardless of your career aspirations...

if you have/get a paying job in a trade you can receive credits toward high school graduation:

- 120 hrs working = 4 credits (up to 16 credits)
- 900+ hrs worked (before age of 20) could qualify student for a \$1,000 award... gave out 30+ scholarships last year
- if you later pursue that trade career,
 those hours count towards certification






PROCESS FOR 2024-2025

- Ensure you have your MyEd password ready to go and familiarize yourself with MyEd. You will be entering course selections on MyEd.
- 2. Browse this website thoroughly so you know all the courses available, checked out the course flow charts, and understand the process.
- Read through the Counsellor's PDF guides below for selecting your courses.
- 4. If applying to a specialty course or program, please fill out the appropriate online application form. The application form links are found at the bottom of the course descriptions.
- 5. Log into MyED to enter your courses (instructions linked here and are in the MyED request section). Paper working copies of course selection worksheets can be picked up in the office and/or library, paper copies



Every Post-Secondary has different admission requirements. It's your responsibility to do your research on this. Universities are now evaluating based on grade 11 and 12 marks.

- Some current examples:
- UBC: Very program specific. It is imperative to check the website
- SFU: Evaluation based on 5 classes (List A & List B Classes)
- Each university will have different admission requirements depending on what program & university you are looking into.






Basic Post Secondary Entrance Requirements
