# Numeracy 10 & Literacy 10 Assessments



All courses satisfy the English 10 requirement and teach reading, writing and speaking skills. The main difference is the content being used to teach these skills.

#### New Courses being offered






#### Fishing and Environment 11


#### **PROCESS FOR 2024-2025**

- 3. Read through the Counsellor's PDF guides below for selecting your courses.
- 4. If applying to a specialty course or program, please fill out the appropriate online application form. The application form links are found at the bottom of the course descriptions.
- 5. Log into MyED to enter your courses (instructions linked here and are in the MyED request section). Paper working copies of course selection worksheets can be picked up in the office and/or library, paper copies



## Course Changes
