## GRADUATION EVENTS

Graduation season is upon us! The class of 2019 is excitedly awaiting their Dinner/Dance and the G19 Student Group has been hard at work ensuring that it's a successful evening for all. Your work is appreciated!

We have met with our grade 12 s recently to share our expectations for the remainder of the year. Our message is simple...take this time to thank the people who have been a significant part of your lives and end your school year on a positive note. Parents, we are asking for your support in continuing to encourage your children to persevere and maintain their focus through to the end of the school year. Students must be passing all their courses in order to attend their graduation activities and many students have post-secondary admissions and scholarships being contingent on their final grades.

We have been very fortunate in that our grads over the past several years have been very respectful of our school community. We would like to maintain this tradition. ## RIVERSIDE STUDENTS ATTAIN SOME COMMENDABLE RESULTS IN CANADIAN MATHEMATICS COMPETITION

The Canadian Mathematics Competition, whose purpose is to challenge the best mathematics students in the country was written by approximately 75043 students on Tuesday, February $26^{\text {th }}$. The students in grades 9, 10 and 11, represented some 1500 schools across Canada.

At Riverside we took part in the Pascal Contest for grade 9's, the Cayley contest for grade 10's and the Fermat Contest for grade 11's and a number of excellent results were recorded. In the Pascal Contest, Riverside's team consisting of the top three scoring students placed in the top 81 \% of all participants which included 24793 students that made up 1078 teams. Individually, Megan Peterson, was the medal winner at Riverside placing in the top $11 \%$ in Canada. Fanny Barakaeva and Stefan Diaconu tied for second placing in the top 26\% in Canada .

In the Cayley Contest written by 18727 students that made up 1017 teams throughout Canada, Riverside placed in the top 15\%. Individually, Justin (Jeongyeol) Park was the medal winner at Riverside placing in the top 1\% in Canada. YeJoon Choi was second placing in the top 3\% in Canada and Mehrshad Esmaeilzdeh was third placing in the top 4\%.

In the Fermat Contest written by 15903 students that made up 1006 teams, Riverside placed in the top 30\%. Individually, Eva (Zheng) Lian was the medal winner at Riverside placing in the top 7 \% in Canada. Alexei Tkachenko was second placing in the top 9\% in Canada and Zhuangda Wang was third placing in the top 11 \% in Canada.

Individually, a total of 9 students qualified for "Certificates of Distinction" by placing in the top quartile among all competitors in Canada.

Members of the Riverside Math Department would like to congratulate all participants for excellent performance and their commitment and perseverance in striving for mathematical excellence. Thanks are also extended to Pitt River Middle, Citadel Middle and Kwayhquitlum Middle for helping to provide a sound foundation for Riverside students.
