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COUNSELLING DEPARTMENT INFORMATION

Scholarship Preparation for Grade 12's

The next Scholarship meeting will be on November 5th and 6th at lunch in room 213. Before Christmas break, grade 12 students should spend some time in the Career Resource Centre (located in the counselling area) or on the Career Centre website researching scholarship opportunities. Many scholarships and bursaries are available for students in a wide variety of areas. Most students can qualify for several. Not all scholarships are purely based on academics. Students are responsible for doing the research but can get assistance from Ms. David in the Career Resource Center. Students who wish to be considered for Major Entrance Scholarships at UBC you must apply to UBC before December 1st. For SFU Major Entrance Scholarships, students must apply before December 15th.

Check University Websites for Application Deadlines

All BC students are considered "early admission" students because the Ministry transfers marks in late April (after students complete their on-line STS form by March). This means that BC students are offered a post-secondary seat before all other students in Canada. Students can apply to almost all postsecondary institutions in BC at https://apply.educationplannerbc.ca/

For admission, universities will be looking at semester one final marks and the April report card marks. Note: UBC and SFU is now considering grade 11 marks for conditional acceptance

PEER TUTORS AVAILABLE FOR ALL STUDENTS

Students needing extra support in their academic classes can request a trained peer tutor. This service can be requested on Riverside's website using the guick link button "Peer Tutoring". Tutors will be assigned based on availability by Mr. Ford (room 225).

Semester Two Schedules

Another copy of student schedules will be handed out before semester 2 in RAP classes. Unfortunately, course changes are not possible for semester 2. All course changes were completed in June.

SENDING TRANSCRIPTS TO UNIVERSITIES AND OTHER POST-SECONDARY INSTITUTIONS

Student Transcripts Service (STS)

Instructions for Grade 12 students

Students who are graduating this year and are applying to post-secondary schools for a September entry must submit STS information to the Ministry on-line. In order for the Ministry to report interim marks this process must be completed by April 30th. If the process is not completed students are responsible for getting their final marks to post-secondary institutions on their own.

- 1. Access the Ministry website www.studenttranscripts.gov.bc.ca
- 2. Students must register for a BC Government account, a **BCeID**. Follow the system prompts and register for STS. Finally log-in to StudentTranscripts Service using the BCeID.
- From a student's STS Dashboard make post-secondary institution selections, view transcript, view assessment results, and send mid-term and final marks when available (2nd option).

SHARE Holiday Hampers

Throughout the end of November and the month of December, Riverside advisories will be collecting non-perishable food for the SHARE hamper program. Donations will be collected every Wednesday in advisory. During the last week of classes, advisories will meet briefly every day to make sure everyone is focused on bringing in their donations. On the final Friday, perishables (potatoes, carrots, apples, milk, cheese, bread, etc.) can be brought in. Students and teachers will deliver the hampers to families on Friday, December 21st.

Numeracy Assessments:

All students in Grade 10 are required to write the Ministry of Education's Numeracy Assessment in their grade 10 school year. At Riverside we have organized this in the semester that they are registered in Math 10 (Foundations and Pre Calculus 10 and Workplace Math 10). Students in Grade 10 who are still working through Math 9 will write in the April assessment period. There are also a number of grade 11 and 12 students who have not yet written this assessment **WHICH IS A GRADUATION REQUIREMENT BY THE MINISTRY.** These students have been identified and told by their counsellors that they have been registered for the November 6th session.

Students currently in Math 10 will write on Wednesday November 6th either from 9-12pm or 1-4pm. These assessments are computer based and will be in rooms 101, 112, 125, 221 or 225. A schedule will be posted next week and shared with their math teachers so the students will have ample notice in which room they will be in and when. Please remind your grade 10 students to listen to announcements or check the posted schedule later this week. Students should be in the room no later than 20 minutes before the exam.

All regular classes will be in session (except for grade 9s who will be at Take your Kid to Work Day). Students will be excused from classes if they are in their exam as scheduled.

Students in Math 10 in second semester will write their Numeracy Assessment on April 17th, 2020.

Literacy Assessments:

Along with Numeracy 10, the Ministry of Education has added a Literacy 10 Assessment for ALL grade 10 students. At Riverside, all grade 10 students will be writing their assessment on January 22nd. A schedule will come out for this in early January.



On Tuesday December 10, the students in our French Immersion and Modern Languages program will have the opportunity to put their language skills to work when the Creperie Le Boheme returns to Riverside. The students can order a variety of sweet crepes in French, Spanish or Italian from the food truck staff.

STUDENT ABSENCES

We only monitor Options #1, #2 and #3 for attendance.

We ask staff to make contact with home regarding repeated lates and absenteeism. Please expect their phone calls.

We have an auto-dialer system which emails homes daily to verify unexcused absenteeism of all students.

All students, if leaving early for any reason, must check out at the office with parent permission. Report to the office to sign back in when you are returning from appointments, etc.

Greetings Riverside Community,

Parking and Drop-Off:

If you drive your child to or from school, please take a moment to review our traffic rules. These are all for the safety of our kids. Thank you!

Even though it's convenient for students at the front door of the school, it's far safer (and faster for you) if you choose an alternate location a safe one, of course!

WINTER WEATHER AHEAD!



Schools are not routinely closed due to snow or other weather conditions. All schools in the Coquitlam School District will remain OPEN, if at all possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

Some of our schools are in very different climate zones from one another and there may be the need for select closings within the district. If there is a partial closure of schools within the district, these individual schools will be identified.

On occasion, full district or partial district closure is required.

Extreme weather can also impact transit bussing. Bus schedules may face significant changes or cancellations due to the weather conditions. Parents seeking infor-

Any district-wide or partial closure will be decided by 6:30 a.m. at the latest and will be announced via **School District 43: website www.sd43.bc.ca** and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.

The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs before 6:30 a.m. so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements, should schools be closed. Please do not call the school just to find out if they are open. While the District tries to make the best decision with the information available, the weather changes quickly and therefore decisions to stay at home during challenging weather conditions should be made by each family.
