#### SCHEDULES FOR NEXT YEAR & GRAD INFORMATION

#### **Grade 12 Marks and Post-Secondary Admissions**

The Ministry sends official copies of student's final marks in July to post-secondary institutions, in order to complete the admissions process. The Ministry can send marks information only if a student has given them permission to do so. Students are required to complete the "Student Transcripts Service" on-line on the Ministry website. Many students have done this already in early spring. For those who have not, counsellors can provide instructions to students and parents, but instructions are also available on the Career Centre web site. **Students must make sure that they have completed this process prior to June 30<sup>th</sup>.** Only students applying for a September 2023 entry need to complete the on-line STS form.

#### **After Graduation**

Your Dogwood (Graduation) Certificate will be sent directly to the school sometime during August. Dogwoods and transcripts are issued in your "legal" name by the Ministry. You will receive an email from the school when they are ready to be picked up – the school office is open throughout the summer. We **DO NOT** mail these out to you.

Transcripts: one copy is mailed to the school for retention with your records, and one directly from the Ministry of Education to your home. You should keep your official copy for yourself; do not give it to any post-secondary institutions you are applying to, instead have them make a photocopy of it. As well, the school will be able to provide an official copy on your request. You can also update the BC Transcript Service with your updated permissions for institutions to view your records.

It is very important that your mailing address, contact, and phone information is up-to-date at school not only while attending but also afterwards, so that documents can be mailed to the correct address. Please check your MyEd Portal to confirm that we have the correct information. If changes are necessary, please email <a href="mailto:lcorcoran@sd43.bc.ca">lcorcoran@sd43.bc.ca</a> or see Mrs. Corcoran in the office. It is particularly important for International Students and any students leaving the country or province to leave a forwarding address with the school office and/or International Education.

# **MATH CONTEST AWARDS**

On June 7<sup>th</sup>, 2023 we celebrated the students from Grade 9 to 12 who participated in this year's 12 math contests. There were 65 "mathletes" who took on the challenge of competing with students across Canada and North America, using their math and logical reasoning to impress the judges. A number of these contests were 2-3 hours long and required full written solutions – not your regular math assessment!

This year our guest speaker was Maryam Bagheri (Riverside Grad 2007) who came and shared a bit about her path after Riverside to her current role as the Director of Acquisitions for Wesgroup Properties. It was very special to have her come and be a part of our celebration, sharing her experience and advice.

Congratulations to all students who signed up and tested themselves this year. A special mention to our graduating students who are now moving onto their next challenge with University – good luck! All students who like a good math challenge are welcome to join the Riverside Math Club next year. Watch for posters and information in September or ask your math teacher.



#### **STEAM TEAM**

Congratulations to the Riverside STEAM Team and the Science 9 Tanzania Bee Project who shared their creations at SFU's Academic Quadrangle. SFU Faculty of Science and SD43 collaborated to create the "GeoHeritage Project". Students chose a place of importance and a geological issue and used a STEAM lens to come up with a solution to a problem that was of concern to them.





The Science 9 students worked with a beekeeper in Tanzania to try and find ways to protect bees, support marketing of bee products and educate people on bees' importance in our food chain. The education materials, blog posts and buttons were on display.

The STEAM team created a prototype for an early detection system for urban fires to try and protect the forest behind Riverside Secondary. All the Riverside students answered questions from professors and dignitaries alike and demonstrated how much deep learning they did through their Project Based Learning. The students were excellent representatives of Riverside and their passion for saving the environment was evident.



# **TRADES PROGRAM**

The trades program starts next September and one area of focus is on Carpentry. Our students will be constructing some sheds as part of their program. 
