OPPORTUNITY FOR 18-YEAR-OLD STUDENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN CANADIAN POLICY-MAKING

Recruitment is now open and will close on May 12, 2023.

We are writing today as we embark on an exciting project to engage youth in a process that brings them to the table on policy making for a safer internet: <u>The Youth</u> <u>Assembly on Digital Rights and Safety</u>.

The Project

Led by McGill University's <u>Centre for Media, Technology and Democracy</u> and citizens' assembly experts <u>MASS LBP</u>, this three-day Youth Assembly on Digital Rights and Safety will directly engage a diverse group of 39 18-year-olds from across Canada, in dialogue with each other, academic experts, and policy makers. The Assembly, which will be held at the Canadian Museum for Human Rights in Winnipeg, Manitoba, aims to determine how young people understand digital rights and what policymakers can do to transform their lived experiences, concerns, and considerations into policy that supports their flourishing online.

Our Request

We are writing to you to ask for your help in recruiting participants for the Assembly. We are looking to reach 18 year olds from coast to coast to coast that represent. Canada's diversity. Eligibility

Anyone living in Canada who will be 18 years old by June 1st, 2023 is eligible to volunteer (generally, grade 12/first year post-secondary).

Selection

Selection will take place by <u>civic lottery</u> in order to ensure participants represent the demographics and diversity of Canada. Our aim will be to include representation of: urban, suburban, and rural/Northern communities, youth who identify as Indigenous, members of the LGBTQ2+ community, ethno-cultural minorities, and youth across the gender spectrum.
