GRADE 12 MARKS AND POST-SECONDARY ADMISSIONS

The Ministry sends official copies of student's final marks in July to post-secondary institutions in order to complete the admissions process. The Ministry can send marks information only if a student has given them permission to do so. Students are required to complete the "Post-Secondary Institution Choice Form" (PSI) on-line on the Ministry website. Many students have done this already. For those who have not, counsellors will provide instructions to students and parents but instructions are available on the counselling department web site as well. Students must make sure that they have completed this process prior to June 30th. Only students applying for a September 2012 entry need to complete the on-line PSI form.

AFTER GRADUATION

Your Dogwood (Graduation) Certificate will be sent directly to the school during summer and they will be mailed to you. Dogwoods and transcripts are issued in your "legal" name by the Ministry.

Transcripts: one copy is mailed to the school for retention with your records, and one directly to your home. You should keep your official copy for yourself; do not give it to any post-secondary institutions you are applying to, instead have them make a photocopy of it. As well, the school will provide a copy on your request.

It is very important that your mailing address, contact, and phone information is up-to-date at school not only while attending but also afterwards so that documents can be mailed to the correct address. It is particularly important for International Students and any students leaving the country or province to leave a forwarding address with International Education and/or the school office.

SCHEDULES FOR 2012/2013

Grade 9 students will be given their schedules on August 31st at the Grade 9 Preview Day. All other students will get their schedules in RAP on the first day of school. There will be an opportunity to request course changes in the first week of September. More details will be available at school start-up.

SUMMER SCHOOL REMINDER

Counsellors will be contacting parents of those students needing to enroll in Remedial Summer School courses after final marks are entered (June 20th). If you anticipate that your child will be attending, it would be wise to set up an account now at: www.summerlearningcoquitlam.ca Students can get their course access code from their counsellor after June 20th, but having an account ahead of time will speed up the process. RIVERSIDE STUDENTS ATTAIN COMENDABLE RESULTS IN CANADIAN MATHEMATICS COMPETITION

The Canadian Mathematics Competition, whose purpose is to challenge the best mathematics students in the country was written by approximately 62 000 students on Thursday, February 23rd. The students in grades 9, 10, and 11, represented some 1 400 schools across Canada.

At **Riverside** we took part in the **Pascal** Contest for **grade 9's**, the **Cayley** contest for **grade 10's** and the **Fermat** Contest for **grade 11's** and a number of excellent results were recorded. In the **Pascal Contest**, Riverside's team consisting of the top three scoring students placed in the top **10 %** of all participants which included 22 485 students that made up 950 teams. Individually, **Tony Chen** was the **medal winner** at Riverside placing in the top **1 % in Canada**. **Alwin Leong** placed **second in the top 3%** and **Daniel Bae and Bryan Logue tied for third**, placing in the top **7%**

In the **Cayley Contest** written by 17 297 students that made up 888 teams throughout Canada, **Riverside** placed in the top **38 %**. Individually **Lukas Plamondon** was the medal winner placing in the top **7%** in Canada. **Julian Roemer** and **Nicola Van Der Mark** placed **second** and **third** respectively in the school and ranked in the **top 18% and 19%** in the country.

In the **Fermat Contest** written by 14 663 students that made up 875 teams, Riverside placed in the top **30%**. Individually, **Louis Chen** was the school medal winner placing in the top **7%** of all participants in Canada. **Katrina Besler** and **Jesse Kazemir** placed second and third respectively and ranked in the **top 11% and 13%**

Individually, a total of **21** students qualified for "**Certificates of Distinction**" by placing in the top **quartile** in Canada.

Members of the **Riverside Math Department** would like to congratulate all participants for excellent performance and their **commitment** and **perseverance** in striving for mathematical excellence. Thanks are also extended to **Pitt River Middle, Citadel Middle and Kwayhquitlum Middle** for providing a sound foundation for Riverside students.

SPAIN, SLOVENIA AND AUSTRIA 2013 SPRING BREAK TOUR

Next spring break, the opportunity exists for Riverside students to travel abroad to Europe and visit some of the most culturally significant historical, economic and political landmarks in the world. Our trip evolves around our sister school in Vienna, Austria and takes us through some of the most breathtaking landscapes and topography in all of Europe. If you've always wanted to sample some of the flavors, experience the warmth and sights of Europe, this is your opportunity.

Our two week trip itinerary has us visiting Spain and all it's splendor including Barcelona, Madrid, Toledo, Granada and Seville. Gothic Cathedrals, soccer matches, the Pablo Picasso Museum and a bull fight are just some of the attractions on the itinerary.

Once through Spain, the trip moves east to Vienna, Austria. Attractions include, the Schoenbrunn Gardens, The Spanish Riding School, The Belvedere Castle, St. Stephen's Cathedral, the Natural History Museum, Art History Museum, taking in a Viennese Waltz class and attending a Strauss Concert at the Hueber Kursalon. While in Vienna, Riverside students will be hosted by students from our sister school, in the historic district, District 3. Visiting historical monuments and museums in Vienna would make up a part of the tour.

While travelling, students would stay in hotels which include breakfast and dinner. Lunches would have to be purchased separately. The trip fee of \$4100 includes air fare, travel insurance, hotel fees, museum and monument entrance fees, tips for guides and transportation by privately chartered bus while travelling.
