Rochester rooted in core values!

You may recall we asked for your feedback last spring about the "kind of school" you wanted to see as part of an ongoing and whole community involved process. We went through a similar process with every student and staff member last year as well. Working through all the feedback was a long but valuable and informative process. Some strong and common themes were evident in all the feedback. We will use these themes to determine our common and core community values.

Attributes concerning *Care*, *Respect*, *Helping Others* or *Service to Others*, *Unity* and *Inclusion* appeared as desired values. In the coming weeks, we will formalize these themes into our common core values. And then the real work begins as we work with our community to teach and model these values so that they become the "lived culture" at the school.

Foundation Skills Assessment for Grade 4's at Rochester

Starting next week, students in Grade 4 will participate in the Province wide Foundation Skills Assessment or FSA. Within the school district, four sources of student assessment data help to inform the decisions of the Board of Education regarding student achievement. Each year, student assessment information is collected from classroom teachers, school assessments, district assessments, and provincial assessments (including FSA and Provincial Exams). These four sources of student assessment data together provide comprehensive evidence of student achievement in Coquitlam School District.

Foundation Skills Assessment measures literacy and numeracy skills set out in provincial curricula. Some facts about FSA:

• FSA is a set of three tests (divided into six parts) administered to Grade 4 and 7 students that cover specific reading, writing and numeracy skills in provincial curricula

FSA measures skills students gain over several school years, not only in a single year
As a provincially prescribed assessment, all Grade 4 and Grade 7 students are expected to participate in the FSA
