On Monday I met with City Bylaw's about our one going laneway issues and on Wednesday I met with our RCMP liaison officer to discuss speeding issues on Schoolhouse and Deciare, especially during the morning commuting period. As well, we have the RCMP and ICBC coming next week to discuss traffic safety with our kids; however, the issues with the laneway and speed are the result of adult decision making. Our kids are quite knowledgeable about safety, but anyone who drives knows all too well, some drivers just don't seem to care. Yesterday morning, a frightening incident occurred on Deciare; a speeding driver nearly hit two of our students in the cross walk. Enough is enough. I appeal to our community to report all speeding issues on Deciare and Schoolhouse to the RCMP. As well, a call to your elected city council member or mayor may help as well. A few speed bumps would help as well as some increased traffic control presence. These responses will only happen if enough people voice their concerns.

As for the city laneway...unless you are a staff member parking or a resident with a house in the laneway, DO NOT use the laneway for pick up or drop off, ever. I have asked City Bylaws to have a presence in the laneway as well. Again, their response is often "encouraged" when multiple reports are made. Also a reminder Staff parking is for staff only as there isn't enough out there for all of us.
