Adoption of agenda

Chair's welcome

Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting. Brief introductions.

Staff guest - Louise St-Arnaud

- Louise St Arnaud is the head teacher and learning services teacher.
- Self-regulation: She demonstrated what is available in the focus bins which contain self-regulation tools such as wiggle seats, lava timers, and squishy balls. Other tools available for self-regulation are in exercise bins, such as kids' exercise balls. Children can also learn how to calm their body in the self-regulation room.
- Learning side: Implemented a guided reading program which is a targetted intervention.
 Starting with Gr. 2-3, she and teachers take 2 classes every day for 6-8 weeks. Looking at what level the children are reading. Children are divided into 4 groups, 5-6 kids at a time. Then target the kids who will continue to need support. Grades 1-2 in winter, Kindergartens in spring. Not ignoring the Grade 4-5.
- Question: Is it in the language they're learning in? Yes
- Question: Is the goal to get up to grade level? Yes. There always will be some that don't. Identify them so they can support as they go through school
- Question: Is it because of Covid? It has always been like that
- Question: Is this the 1st time? Yes.
- Question: Is it a Rochester or school district program? It is Rochester initiative.
- Question: What tier is it? It's tier 1 all kids in classroom
- Question: Does Christie the SLP participate? She knows about it, but her program is specific.
- Question: Is it open to parent participation maybe, this time they are seeing what might not be working and will adjust as necessary, but it could happen later on. Specific criteria are being identified by teachers in the program.
- Resource requests:
 - The school is not rich in resources. They don't have any guided reading books in English. Requesting a set of readers for Learning Services in English. Cost \$3,000 -\$5,000. There is funding for French.
 - Intermediate: fine motor skills output is very hard for some kids, not just those with a designation. Computers can help. Laptops for Learning Services specifically, not just the carts for classes.
 - Priority is books.
