PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Now that the bulk of our construction work has been completed at Summit and we have full access to all exit doors, we are placing a focus on practicing a variety of evacuation drills with our students and staff.

To being with, Teresa Ascoli, our Acting Vice Principal, has done some outstanding work on updating and publishing our evacuation spaces (classrooms, gym, MPR, etc). With Mrs. Greissel's expertise with graphic design, we were able to create professional-looking, easy to read maps to be posted in every instructional space.

Further, we have set dates (one per month for the remainder of the year) for fire drills, earthquake drills, hold and secure (formerly Code Yellow) and lockdown (formerly Code Red). For the fire and earthquake drills, we will practice evacuating the building and returning to the building after the drill.

Please note that we will no longer be holding the "Alternate Pick Up'" days that were previously scheduled for April and May. Following discussion with staff and with our PAC members, we felt that the walk to the church parking lot for pickup could be a safety concern for students (inadequate supervision). Also, the traffic snarls and challenges with communication for families seemed to make the exercise feel counterproductive. Instead, we will be focusing on the drills as outlined above.

Finally, our PAC Chair Jane Freeman and Teresa Ascoli are working hard to ensure that all of our emergency preparedness supplies are up-to-date and accessible in the event of an emergency.

Please do not hesitate to contact me should you have any questions regarding our school-wide focus on safety drills over the next few months.
