Credits must be earned in the following subject areas or courses:

- Language Arts 10 (4 credits)
- Language Arts 11 (4 credits)
- Language Arts 12 (4 credits)
- Social Studies 10 (4 credits)
- Social Studies 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- Mathematics 10 (4 credits)
- Mathematics 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- Science 10 (4 credits)
- Science 11 or 12 (4 credits)

- Physical and Health Education 10 (4 credits)
- An Arts Education and/or an Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies 10, 11, or 12 (4 credits)
- Career Life Education (4 credits)
- Career Life Connections (4 credits)
- 28 elective credits (28 credits)
- Numeracy & Literacy Exams
- Indigenous Credit (EFP 11 or BC First Peoples 12)



Course Selection

- Course selection in grade 11/12 is important!
- Take the time to look at all courses and what courses have prerequisites
- Make sure you have all required courses/assessments to graduate
- Make sure you are taking courses required for post-secondary programs
- Post secondary schools/faculties have different requirements
- Some post-secondary schools will look at grade 11 marks for early admissions
- Always connect with a counsellor if you have questions, we are here to help

- 1. English 12
- 2. Career Life Connections (CLC) 12


What is CLC 12?

- 1. Course outside of the timetable
- 2. Course content is delivered through TEAMS and monthly assemblies
- 3. Each student is assigned a CLC teacher
- 4. Helps develop a student's personal interests
- 5. Gives students an opportunity to explore career/post-secondary options



Transcript Verification Report

- Grade 12 students need to register for a basic account
- To register go to www.bceid.ca
- All grads must download their own official graduation transcripts via Student Transcript Services. Final transcripts are NOT automatically sent to grads and school no longer provide official transcripts.

Example of Degree Requirements

Science Degree Program at UBC

 English 12, Pre-Calc 12, One other science 12 and another academic grade 12 course

Your grade 12 Schedule

English 12, Pre-Calc 12,
 Physics 12 and Chemistry 12

Arts Degree Program at UBC

 English 12 and 4-5 approved academic classes but some will need 6

Your grade 12 Schedule

 English 12, Biology 12, History 12, Geography 12, Math Found 12 and Law 12

Most programs at UBC are minimum mid 80-90 percent average of 5-6 academic courses

Food for Thought

BIG Universities such as UBC and SFU send out early conditional offers based on prerequisite courses taken in grade 11. Conditional acceptance can be pulled.

So, for example pre-calculus/ foundations of math, Chemistry and physics 12 are pre-requisites to go into science and engineering therefore it's advised that students take the same at the grade 11 level. They will use the grades from grade 11 courses plus interim and final semester 1 grade 12 courses- to evaluate the application and send offers. If not satisfied or meeting, they will wait for interim marks for semester 2.

Calculus 12 is a requirement for most Business schools in Ontario.

As a general rule: Calculus cannot be used to replace Pre-calculus and vice versa.

Chemistry 11 and Biology 11 are recommended pre-requisites for Grade 12 Biology.

University Transfer Programs

Douglas and other colleges offer amazing transfer programs!

These programs are good options for students who:

- a. Do no meet entrance requirements
- b. Want to upgrade courses (some offer free upgrades for high school level classes)
- c. Could benefit from smaller campus and class sizes
- d. Are not 100% sure of what they want to do or study (try general)

Can often transfer up to 60 credits towards a degree at University







Scholarships

Loans

Bursaries

Scholarships & Awards

Applicants receive money for their education

Scholarships are awarded based on a variety of criteria:

- Academic excellence
- Athletic abilities
- Leadership qualities
- Service to the community.

You do not need to be a top student to qualify for scholarships!

Bursaries

Bursaries are awarded based on financial need & other criteria. Usually, official documentation confirming your financial situation is required.

Loans

Money borrowed by student demonstrating financial need, needs to be repaid. For example: from bank or government

Usually, applications available in early June.

Many financial institutions also have student banking packages that include borrowing for educational purposes.

Types of Scholarships/Bursaries

- Entrance scholarships
- Local scholarships/bursaries
- External scholarships/bursaries
- Provincial scholarships

Post Secondary Entrance Scholarships

- Many post-secondary institutions offer entrance scholarships.
- Common criteria: GPA, community involvement, essay
- Remember that each institution sets its own criteria and that its website is the most reliable source of information.

Local Scholarships/Bursaries

These awards are provided by organizations in our local community/school district. The scholarship application package for Terry Fox students are available in the spring.

External Scholarships/Bursaries

These scholarships are administered by third-party organizations and may be need or merit-based.

Example: TD Scholarships for Community Leadership (students will be given information at scholarship meetings)
