## The BC Transfer System



The **BC Transfer System** is a network of post-secondary institutions that allow students to move from one institution to another and receive credit for previous coursework. Transfer options offer a number of advantages for students. For example, transfer students can:

- Plan their education pathways because institutions have created transfer agreements in advance
- Take advantage of lower admission requirements for students who have completed 24 or more credits
- Be admitted to a university based on their post-secondary rather than high school grades, provided they have completed the required number of credits
- Complete up to two years of study closer to home towards a four-year degree at another institution
- Take advantage of institutions that offer smaller class sizes and lower tuition fees

The BC Transfer System is made up of all BC public post-secondary institutions and several private and out-of-province institutions. For more information about the BC Transfer System, please visit [bccat.ca](http://bccat.ca).

**BCTransferGuide.ca** is the place to learn about your transfer options. *Transfer* occurs when one institution recognizes education completed at another. At BCTransferGuide.ca, students can review transfer agreements for courses they have already completed. If an agreement is published at BCTransferGuide.ca, the transfer credit is *guaranteed* to be awarded once the student is admitted to the receiving institution.
