ARTICULATION FOR THE 2013-2014 SCHOOL YEAR 年度重点

At the end of each year, the leadership team at Walton meets formally with each classroom teacher to discuss the needs of each child prior to organizing classes for the upcoming school year. There are some foundational beliefs and understandings with which this process begins. First, all teachers at Walton Elementary are competent and capable of providing an appropriate learning situation for every child. Second, as with all reflective professionals, the teachers at Walton make changes in their approaches and strategies of teaching to accommodate the students they serve. Third, a team approach is applied to working with children. Your child works with a number of teachers who support each other and work together to meet the needs of your child.

While logistics prevent us from including parents in this lengthy process, we would like to provide you with this opportunity to be apprised of the many facets that go in to this process.

As you are likely aware, most students in BC may expect to be in combined classes several times during their elementary and middle school years. As well, there are laws (regarding class size and the placement of special needs children) that must be adhered to when organizing classes for learning. The school leadership team will do its utmost to provide the most positive, productive learning environment possible for all students within these limits. The following are some of the factors considered in the class building process:

- ✓ Classroom teacher and school based team recommendations
- ✓ The overall make up of the class being created
- ✓ Learning styles
- ✓ Intellectual, emotional, social, and physical development
- ✓ Behavioural issues
- ✓ Need for student services such as learning assistance
- ✓ Female/male balance
- ✓ Pre-existing supportive relationships between children

While each factor is important, each is weighted differently depending upon the individual circumstances under discussion. Decisions will always be made with the child in mind and the more global view of the class composition and school organization.

The following are NOT factors considered during the class building process:

- Child's previous placement in a combined or single grade classroom
- Parent preference for a specific teacher

Most parents will not need to communicate anything to the school regarding placement, as the teaching staff is knowledgeable about your child and their learning needs. In the unlikely event that you would like to share some health or learning information about your child which we might not be aware of, please note the following procedure: *Come to the office and pick up an information sharing form so your thoughts are in writing. Helpful information includes information about the learning environment or medical concerns. Please do not state which teacher you do or do not wish your child to be placed with next year.*

Naturally as parents you want what you perceive to be in your own child's best interests. We respect your role as advocates for your child, but we have the difficult job of ensuring the best possible learning environment for <u>all</u> children in the school. As you can see by the process outlined above, the staff at Walton works very hard to create classes that meet the many diverse needs of our students.

Unfortunately with the many changes that occur over the summer and early into the fall, it is impossible for us to let families know now, what class their child will be in next year. The classes will be finalized during the first or second week of school in September.
