Back in 1981, the 21st century seemed like a long way in the future. If you asked me in 1981 what I thought a classroom would like in 2014, I might have described the bridge of the Starship Enterprise.

You've probably heard much about "21st century" learning.



There is no single definition of what this looks like; but a recognition that skills needed in a global community are changing. As I wrote last month, the education I received in the 1970s could not have prepared me well enough for the future. The British Columbia curriculum is also undergoing changes and the drafts are now on-line.

Progressive education isn't necessarily connected with technology. Technology is certainly a component because our students will need to utilize some form of technology in their career or trade.

To me, "21st century" involves:

- Critical thinking
- Communication
- Collaboration
- Creativity

The technology is already here, we just have to learn how to use it in powerful, effective and ethical ways.

Walton is an example of a school moving in this direction.

Back at my Grade 8 Open House n 1981, in front of hundreds of parents, my dad stood up in the packed cafeteria and asked, "Do the kids still learn Latin?"

Latin?



I slipped under the table to hide.

My father, growing up in Nanaimo in the 1930s and 1940s learned Latin in high school. Latin was a relevant subject seventy years ago.

In the 1980's, we could only learn French as our second

language.

Now the canvas has broadened to include many different languages. Of course, Mandarin is offered at Walton.

Learning Mandarin in the Greater Vancouver area makes great sense. We are such a multicultural community. Our students can use their Mandarin language skills in many practical settings around our city.

Think of the world that our students are entering in several years where critical thinking, communication, collaboration and creativity are needed.

What countries may emerge as the next economic powers, if they haven't already?

What skills will our students need in fifteen or twenty years?

"21st Century" learning is a recognition that the skill sets and knowledge needed today and in the future are much different than the past.




