PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Westwood Families,

We hope everyone had a wonderful Chinese New Year, a Happy Valentine's Day, 100 Day, and enjoyed some of the cool, clear late-winter weather. Whew, February was a very busy month! We are now in the home stretch to Spring Break, but still have a few important items to share with parents – Report Cards!

Report Card time can be an anxious time for everyone involved: students, parents, and teachers. Students are working hard (between all the exciting events). Teachers are spending time assessing student progress in a number of academic, social, and emotional areas. They use a variety of formative assessment methods, adjusting instruction as needed to meet the learning needs of their students, and summative assessments to determine the learning that has taken place. Performance Standards, criterion-referenced assessment, observations and quizzes are all instruments teachers use in this process. Pulling all this information together can be a daunting task, sometimes involving teachers getting together to collaborate to assess learning. The Report Card itself is not a cumulative record, but is intended to be a snapshot of where the child is at, at the time of the report. It is a challenging task to encapsulate student progress in a concise written report and to include all the details that are so individualized for each child. Should you have any questions after receiving your child's Report Card, please contact your child's teacher to book an appointment.

The Term 2 Formal Report Card will be going home with students on March 14th.

Another way that students can demonstrate their learning is through the Student-Led Conference. We will be having an Early Dismissal on **Wednesday**, April 13th to facilitate the conferences. We hope you can attend so that your child can share their learning with you!

As the year progresses, additional events are being added to our calendar. One such event is Literacy Week. Literacy Week will run April 4 - 8, and details will be available soon - stay tuned! Finally, due to budgetary reasons, Spring Break this year is a two week event and runs (March 21 - April 1). Westwood Elementary will re-open on Monday, April 4^{th} .
