VOLUNTEER IN SCHOOLS

Are you thinking about volunteering in a school for the 2011-2012 school year? If so, the Coquitlam RCMP is encouraging all would-be school volunteers to start the criminal record check process as soon as possible.

Policy changes introduced last year require anyone planning to work, either professionally or in a volunteer capacity, in the "vulnerable sector" to complete an enhanced criminal record search process that may include the need to submit fingerprints in order to get the record check approved.

The vulnerable sector policy protects the safety of kids and youth by catching pardoned sex offenders who are attempting to secure volunteer or professional positions using different names. Under the policy, any applicant whose gender and birth date match those of one of the 14,000+ pardoned sex offenders in the national sex offender registry will be required to submit fingerprints, which can extend the record check process by weeks or months.

STUDENT DOCUMENTATION

In the past few months several schools in our District and other Districts went through a BC Ministry of Education audit. Critical student funding was lost due to incomplete student documentation. Mostly this was because the BC Ministry of Education documentation regulations have changed since students registered a year or more ago.

It is such a huge undertaking going through all of our 240 student files as we have to: identify what needs to be added to the file and then advise parents of what is needed. We have started with our grade 5 students to ensure that the middle schools that receive these files and receive them in their complete form.

We understand the inconvenience of coming into the school to provide this documentation, but ask for your cooperation with this task. If your child's file requires any documentation, we will contact you by email or by letter sent home with information on what is required. We would then ask that you bring in the requested documents as soon as possible. School District 43 and S.U.C.C.E.S.S.
