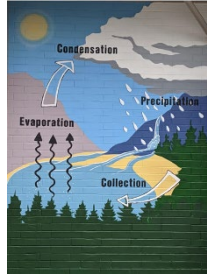


4. The Lord Baden Powell (LBP) Elementary School community has now transformed their outdoor courtyard into a new outdoor classroom.

With the coordination of the Parent Advisory Council and the generous donation of \$10,000 from the Coquitlam Royal Canadian Legion, the school is thrilled to be learning outdoors with their new wheelchair accessible picnic tables and benches and two large white boards.

A mural was also painted by artist Laura Johnson who collaborated with Cree artist, Jeska Slater, Kwantlen First Nation youth artist, Elinor Atkins and Katzie youth, Carlyn Andres showcasing Indigenous art welcoming the LBP community. The mural features the ʔəmi ce:p kʷətxʷiləm message that translates to "you are welcomed" and complements the welcome pole at the entrance of the school. Traditionally, these welcome pole figures were placed on lands for visitors to see as they entered the territory of the local land-based nations in Coast Salish Territories.





The mural also shows the land behind the figure that represents the Kwikwetlem First Nation territory on which Lord Baden Powell School resides and honours the Kwikwetlem First Nation by adding small red fish in the river. The word Kwikwetlem means “small red salmon” and refers to the unique sockeye salmon that once ran in large numbers in the Coquitlam River and Coquitlam Lake.

Though the courtyard transformation project is far from finished, the PAC is excited to showcase the space and is looking forward to celebrating with the Coquitlam Legion, Lord Baden Powell Department Heads, artists, district officials, board trustees, PAC executive and media.

6. SD43 students participated in the Fresh Roots Farms Sustainable Opportunities for Youth Leadership (SOYL) program, a 6-week summer leadership and empowerment summer program where high school students learned the importance of growing, selling and cooking food. Students also had the opportunity to practice their negotiation and speaking skills as they educated buyers on the process of harvesting and the importance of protecting the food system at the Fresh Roots pop-up market at Millside Centre on Thursdays.
7. Last school year, Eagle Mountain Middle School chose the novel, "Rick" by Alex Gino as its school-wide read. The book discusses a boy beginning middle school going through his struggles of friendship while discovering his identity and new connections as he attends an after-school club, called the Rainbow Spectrum Club.

Inspired by this story and theme of diversity, students participated in a "quilt project" where they each decorated a 3"x 3" square and wrote a brief description about themselves. These were then organized by SD43 teacher Simon Kwok into a rainbow "quilt", which is now displayed at the front entrance of the school as a way to welcome all students to the new school year and as a daily reminder that each student brings their own uniqueness to the school.



8. The École Moody Middle School of the Arts community is excited to share the news about their newly painted rainbow coloured crosswalk and to be the very first school in the district to boast one. Principal Mark Clay writes, "Our school-wide theme this year is around "identity and belonging" and I had been wanting them done for awhile now.
