Victoria Park – a history

- 1916: school originally built on this site
- 1964: school closed
- 1968: school building demolished
- Past 30 years: Victoria Hall and parkland



Victoria Park – about the site

- School district owns nine individual lots at the southeast portion of Victoria Park
- 0.83 acres or 0.34 hectares
- P1 (Civic Institutional) city zoning

Victoria Park – future potential

- Not anticipated for future school potential
- Owned by Coquitlam School District
- Designated as parkland in community plans

We Heard – sell it as a park

- Sell to the City of Coquitlam as a park
- Set money aside for future school use

We Heard – sell it for revenue

- Sell for housing
- Generate revenue for a new school
