Vocational Programs

- Offered at Vancouver Community College (VCC), BCIT, and other trades schools
 - Programs lead to designated trades attached to apprenticeships to complete the program
 - Programs vary in type and length—a few weeks to 2 years for some

Vocational Program Requirements

- High school graduation
- Some specific course requirements
- Usually has rolling application dates and deadlines

UBC General Admissions Information

- **Minimum final grade of 70% in an English 11 and English Studies 12**
- **Complete the Personal Profile & any Supplemental Applications requested.**
- **ALL the grade 11 and 12 courses the student has completed are considered to make a holistic admissions decision *except for* ADST, Career Education and Physical Education**
- **Min. of 6 Grade 12 courses (Check the website for specifics)**
- **Min. requirement is a Second Language 11**
- **Min. requirement of Proficient , or a 3 on the Literacy 12 Assessment**
- **Check Faculty and Program Specific Requirements on their Website**

SFU General Admission Information

- English Studies 12 with a minimum final grade of 70%.
- Some programs will require a Supplemental Application.
- Minimum of 5 SFU Approved grade 12 courses
- All grade 11 and 12 Approved Courses Count
- Check Faculty and Program Specific Requirements (on the SFU Website)
- Min. language is Introductory Language 11/Language 11

English Studies 12 in Second Semester

- This is not a disadvantage for students applying to UBC, SFU, etc.
- Universities will refer to grade 11 marks to make their early decisions.

Delta Language Challenge Exam

- UBC: The language challenge exam may be used to fulfill the language requirement only.
- SFU and UVIC will include the grades received as part of the PA calculation and fulfill the language requirement
- Registration is in October & the Test is taken in January on a weekend—must be able to get to Delta to write.

CAREER EDUCATION 10 OPTIONS

THREE OPTIONS:

1. Grade 10 students may take Career Education AT PMSS in a classroom
2. OR Take it at **Summer School** (sign up and complete before September)—Start date is JULY, and it is not connected to PMSS. **IB students should take Careers 10 at Summer School or Online.**
3. OR Take it with a PMSS On-Line COHORT starting in September and finishing in June with PMSS teacher overseeing your progress—no classroom, but the online teacher is at the school to support you. Start date is SEPTEMBER.

Once you commit to taking it with PMSS On-line it is expected that you DO IT. If you are planning to take it at summer school please DO NOT sign up for our PMSS COHORT.

Note that you MUST take an elective in place of the Career Education class, as all students are expected to be in EIHT classes at PMSS regardless of the on-line courses they are attending.

IB Consideration

- Students who are not full Diploma must fill out an extra form to be considered for any IB course
- Must have **teacher recommendation** or previous IB course.
- IB Diploma students are given consideration first followed then all other student requests. (you will find out in June, if you get the class)
- Note: **IB courses have external costs.**
- IB consideration forms can be picked up at the **front office...**

IB Consideration Form

Students are to fill out regular programming sheet first.

If accepted into IB courses counsellor will change request from regular to IB. IB Consideration forms are available at the Office

IB Diploma students have priority for selection and loading of IB courses. We do however, support students pursuing challenging courses providing:

- ❖ There is available room in courses after diploma students are placed
- ❖ You have demonstrated success at the prerequisite IB level - or
- ❖ You have teacher or IB coordinator recommendation to support that you have demonstrated previous performance levels which would indicate the ability to succeed in IB courses.

Regardless of your career aspirations...

if you have/get a paying job in a trade you can receive credits toward high school graduation:

- 120 hrs working = 4 credits (up to 16 credits)
- 900+ hrs worked (before age of 20) could qualify student for a \$1,000 award... gave out 30+ scholarships last year
- if you later pursue that trade career, those hours count towards certification

SOAR Leadership 11: SOAR's (Student Offering Affirmation and Reassurance) mandate is to ease the transition for incoming grade 9's to PMSS. A team of 4 SOAR leaders is assigned to each Science 9 and English 9 class. Throughout the year, the SOAR leaders design lessons and go once a week to deliver a 20-30 minute mini-lesson to their grade 9 students. Leaders meet during lunch to plan lessons, assist with Grade 9 orientation in August and Grade 8 tours in January. (Only students currently in grade 10, who will be in grade 11 next year will be considered for SOAR)

Athletic Leadership 10-12: Students develop leadership skills by organizing school and community sports and recreational programs. Leadership students oversee running intramurals and drop-in gym programs during lunch blocks. In addition, they were involved with helping run athletic programs by score keeping, managing teams, help run meets, and even assist coach.

PMSS Leadership 10-12: Students will be a part of organizing, planning and participating in school events. The leadership class will help school counsellors and administration with school-based events such as parent nights, fundraisers etc. This class is an ideal fit for students who are passionate about building leadership skills through enhancing school community and cultivating school spirit. It is an expectation of this course that students will participate in volunteer time outside of normal instructional time organizing and running different events. This is a full-year linear course that runs outside of the school day and will meet some days after block 5. **PLEASE SIGN UP FOR THIS COURSE ON-LINE.**

You may apply for 1, 2 or all 3 leadership courses, but will be assigned to only ONE course. Please write which courses you are applying to and rank them in order of priority for you.
