WHAT IS YOUTH TRAIN IN TRADES?

Youth TRAIN in Trades offers students the opportunity to earn their Level 1 Trades Certification while in high school. Students can take one of our district's 20+ Trades Training Programs and earn both high school and post-secondary credits. All of our programs are tuition free, giving all high school students access to post-secondary education and the opportunity get a head start in their career!

WHY REGISTER FOR THE TRAIN IN TRADES PROGRAM?

- Earn post-secondary training in a trade of choice
- Start your apprenticeship early
- Exposure to professionals in the industry and networking opportunities
- Get a head start on your Red Seal certification
- Be exposed to career opportunities right out of high school
- Have the opportunity to take the WORK in trades program
- Study a subject of interest

WHAT IS YOUTH WORK IN TRADES?

Youth WORK in Trades isn't a traditional high school course. Students in this program already have a paid job with an experienced tradesperson and complete the coursework online through Coquitlam Open Learning. By taking this program students will have the opportunity to track their hours through the ITA and count them towards their apprenticeship. Moreover, students will also be able to gain high school credits for their hours worked in trades.

WHY REGISTER FOR THE WORK IN TRADES PROGRAMS?

Students who work in an apprenticeable trade with a certified tradesperson, they can:

- gain up to 16 high school credits
- learn and apply specific skills while getting paid
- earn hours towards trade certification
- qualify for a \$1000 award from the Ministry of Education.
