

Post Secondary Training

Pre-Requisites

You **must** have the following courses completed before entering the program:

- Auto 11 ("B", ideally "A")
- English 11 and a plan for English 12
- any Math 11 ("C+")

Since you will be fixing large trucks, it would be **strongly recommended** to have experience in one or more of the following courses or areas:

- Welding or Metal Fabrication
- Automotive 12

Equipment & Costs

Tuition: Free! SD43 will cover this fee.

Student fee: approximately **\$1,400**. (materials, laundry, UPass, other VCC fees,...)

Students must supply their own **CSA** approved **safety boots** and (clear) **safety glasses.**

Program Schedule

This **10-month program** is taught at **VCC** (Broadway). There are **4 intake months** (Sept., Nov., April & July). Actual school days and times vary depending on the intake. Students will **not** get a Spring and/or Summer Break.

Program Credits

Students who successfully pass this Trades Training program will gain:

- 28 high school credits (grade 12 level) that count towards graduation
- VCC course credits
- Level 1 technical training recognized by the Industry Training Authority (ITA) and 450 certification hours

Application Process

Go to:

www.sd43.bc.ca/CareerPrograms (select the trade) to learn more about the program and to print off an application (top link in right column).

Completed **application forms**, which include a **letter of reference** and an **updated resume**, are submitted to their **counselors**.

Applications are taken on a "rolling basis", meaning students can apply any time after Sept. 1st of the current school year for the following school year's intake

The Coquitlam coordinator will do a personal interview once a completed application is received, Final decisions are made in mid-May but early offers of acceptance will be granted in some areas where there is strong application.

Successful applicants will then have to complete a VCC application.

Program intake limited to 1-2 students **per intake**
