- School District No. 43 (Coquitlam) will be conducting the Foundation Skills Assessment in February and March (postponed from January-February), in accordance with the School Act. The Foundation Skills Assessment measures literacy and numeracy skills set out in provincial curricula and is only one source of the data that teachers and the district use to establish comprehensive evidence of student achievement in the Coquitlam School District. <u>A letter regarding</u> <u>the Foundations Skills Assessment (FSA) Information for Grades 4 and 7 students was sent to Parents/ Guardians</u> <u>January 5<sup>th</sup></u>.
- 2. Early (kindergarten) and Late Programs of Choice applications were accepted January 7<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> and January 8<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> respectively. Kindergarten registration for children that turn five this calendar year begins Wednesday, January 27<sup>th</sup> and remains open until Thursday, February 4<sup>th</sup>. A switch to a streamlined online process allowed families to apply for Kindergarten without visiting school sites to maintain a safe environment at SD43 schools. Cross catchment applications are being accepted Friday, February 5th to Wednesday,

On January 14, 2021 administrators and district leadership focused their *Learning Without Boundaries* session on an opportunity to wrestle with the concept of Equity, specific to the Equity Scan recently completed within SD43. After an initial introduction, break out groups worked through exercises that guided individuals to have their ideas, understandings and perspectives enhanced by hearing from others. Through the protocol, the groups explored and clarified their thinking and had their assumptions, beliefs and questions addressed to gain a deeper understanding of how equitable opportunities may be improved for indigenous learners.
