1. From May 30th to June 1st, SD43 held its STEAM Challenge Days where 21 elementary and 8 middle schools embarked on an out-of-this-world experience with their space-themed challenges.

With each station, students start with a period of ideation, then challenge their design using critical and creative thinking skills while using effective communication and collaboration to complete the following challenges:

Challenge 1: Air-Powered Paper Rocket Station

Students learned to design, build, and launch three paper rockets using clay, PVC pipes, paper and cardboard allowing them to understand the concept of air pressure and design elements that would propel each rocket to fly further!

Challenge 2: Sampling Arm

Students acted as engineers designing an apparatus that could scoop samples on a simulated "moon rover" using a scooter board, rubber bands, Makedo, and strings.

Challenge 3: Swimming on a Moon

Students raced the icy waters of Europa, Jupiter's moon, using Sphero programmable robots, elastic bands, cleaning pipes, and Velcro straps.






9. On May 30th, École Coquitlam River Elementary School officially opened their brand-new playground, which has been eagerly anticipated by their amazing students!

13. On May 19th, École Irvine Elementary School hosted a Verbathon Tournament at the school gym where teams of French Immersion students from Grades 2-5 competed by showing how fast they can conjugate French verbs – yes verbs!

It was a fun community "sport-like" event with the participation of parent volunteers, students, and teachers. Students were also excited to receive prizes at the end of the competition!

Pre-pandemic, French Immersion schools in SD43 participated in a district-wide tournament sponsored by Canadian Parents for French. A national tournament that was held every two years with the participation of thousands of Immersion, Francophone and FSL (French as a Second Language) students from schools across Canada. The first national tournament was held in 2000.

Verbathon was developed by Emmanuel Escueta, a Grade 2/3 French Immersion teacher at Irvine Elementary School, to make verb and grammar learning fun for students. This innovative language teaching system was also a significant factor in Mr. Escueta being awarded the Prime Minister's Award for Excellence in Teaching in 2016.



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14. The SD43 Gold Classic, presented by Polygon Homes, has successfully raised \$37,000 for KidSport Tri-Cities this year. This annual golf event brings together 144 employees and friends of SD43, with the support of community partners and staff volunteers.



Westwood Plateau has played a crucial role as a partner, offering a high-quality course, excellent food, and a well-organized tournament that has contributed nearly \$200,000 over the years.
