# Coast Salish Elementary: B.C.'s First Net-Zero Energy School

Coast Salish Elementary in Coquitlam has made history as British Columbia's first netzero energy school. This groundbreaking achievement is the result of a collaboration between School District 43, the Province of B.C. and BC Hydro.



The school is designed to produce as much energy as it consumes annually, thanks to features like highefficiency heat pumps, LED lighting, and a rooftop solar array. These innovations not only reduce greenhouse gas emissions but also serve as a living classroom, inspiring students to engage with sustainability firsthand.

This milestone reflects a shared commitment to environmental stewardship and sets a new standard for sustainable education in our province.
