SD43 Sustainability Project (Gr. 9-12)

The District's Sustainability and Energy Management Team has partnered with the District's STEAM Team on a secondary-focused <u>Sustainability Project</u>.

Between November 2023 and April 2024, secondary school teams will investigate and document sustainability action inquiries. All of our secondary schools have nominated STEAM Ambassadors. STEAM Ambassadors are students involved in promoting STEAM ways of learning, and the Sustainability Project.

The Sustainability Project will focus on the UN Sustainable Development Goals 11, 12, and 13: Sustainable Cities and Communities, Responsible Consumption and Production, and Climate Action.

For example:

- Inquiry Hub Secondary's focus is "...observing our school's structure and our surrounding area ... find[ing] materials that can help withstand the shock of an earthquake, and how we can incorporate it into a school".
- Centennial plans to, "...raise awareness about sustainability issues, influence behavior changes, and design potential improvements to transportation and waste issues in our city".
- One of Dr. Charles Best's teams, "will be focusing on making the area surrounding our school safer and more accessible to bicycles".
- Pinetree Secondary's team, "would like to address the problem of waste created by fast fashion and consumption culture in general".

As their next step, all project teams will consider their chosen topic through the use of the SD43 STEAM Lenses / Optique STIAM. Following this, teams will undertake STEAM Action/Design to solve the problem, meet the challenge, and/or learn more. Finally, teams will communicate their learning at a district Sustainability Fair in the spring of 2024.

The goals of the project are action-oriented; to have students involved in STEAM ways of learning and to contribute through positive local action (which has a larger impact because of the involvement of all schools).

We will be having a Giant pumpkin-growing competition starting this Spring.

We have contacted Dave Keen, our local Giant Pumpkin growing expert who is happy to provide us with seeds from his biggest pumpkin and assist us with growing tips and encouragement.

The pumpkin seeds will need to germinate and then be planted by the schools. A pumpkin does not need an elaborate planting spot, you can select a spot on school grounds or a school could select an alternative planting spot such as a staff, student, or neighbor's place to provide better care over the summer.

\$200 will be given to the school with the biggest pumpkin to spend on anything to do with sustainability education. The big weigh-off will take place on Halloween 2024.
