
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Looking Ahead: Sustainability Events




💡 Turn It Off Challenge:

Step 3: Identify all the birds you see or hear within your planned time/location and use the best tool for sharing your bird sightings: Try using the <u>Merlin Bird ID app</u> to tell us what birds you are seeing or hearing.
