

Find inspiration and explore artistic techniques, subjects and themes featured in the works of Chinese Canadian master printmaker, Anna Wong. These include nature prints, exercises in abstraction, travel themes, and mixed-media projects.

9 am-3 pm | Free, 9 sessions *participation required for all sessions

Senior secondary students take on the role of a professional artist to create an exhibition in the gallery. Guided by practicing artists, curators, and programmers, students create artwork and learn how to develop and promote their show. Artwork is produced from March 13 to April 30 with regular check-ins by programming staff. Volunteer hours accrued may be used towards career placement programs.

Spend the day at Deer Lake Park by taking a program at the Burnaby Art Gallery in the morning and visiting the Burnaby Village Museum in the afternoon!


On nice weather days, lunch could be enjoyed in Deer Lake Park, or request the lunch room at the Museum when you book.
