Counselling at Smiling Creek Jillian Riederer JRiederer@sd43.bc.ca	* Started working in 2006 as a classroom teacher, then went through counselling training and started as a councillor 11 years ago * Described the "Three tiers of support" where 1-7 percent of students require individualized supports, 5-15 percent require some group supports and the entire school benefits from universal system of school-wide support * Individual session: * Highest concern right now is anxiety * Weekly session for 35-45 minutes with ranging durations throughout the school year * 4 parts of a session: * Check-in (how is the student doing) * Tool time (led by Ms. Riederer) * Free choice (play therapy which is also Ms. Riederer's focus in her training) * Wishing time * Group session * focus on social skills and growth (but because of covid there are no cross classroom groups * Similar format to individual session

AGENDA ITEM NOTES * Class wide session * Focus on social emotional learning * Smiling Creek Staff also supplements their teaching with similar techniques * Gives Ms. Riederer a chance to know each student in the school * Term one she worked with 5 classrooms on the following: * E.A.S.E. (Everyday Anxiety Strategies for Educators) * Mood Meter * Zones of Regulation * Safe Bodies * Social Thinking * MindUP (mindfulness and meditation) * Restorative circles: build positive relationship within the class * School wide * Help with resolving conflict during recess or lunch time * Any student can also see Ms. Riederer if they are having a bad day and need a space to calm down * There is a student wellness page in the school website (that is in progress and will have more information coming) * Help with the school leadership program: * Smile Squad (originally was peace squad): group of grade 4/5 are trained to be peer helpers to help kids in the playground * Spirit squad: students that help come up with spirit wear theme and make posters * Announcement helper with Mr. Jacobsen * Students can be referred for counselling support by teachers, parents or self referral * Q: How many days does Ms. Riederer work at the school? * 3.5 (M, W, Thursday all day, Friday morning) * Q: When do you expect small group class to resume? * Small groups are happening now but only within the same learning groups, mix learning groups are based on PHO orders * Q: Do kids know what their issues are? * Yes usually they know what they're working on, and learning

- * Q: Are there any issues with confidentiality?
 - * We talk about privacy and to let the students know that their privacy is very important, but also let them understand when safety is a concern that some things will be shared. Among teachers, sometimes general terms are shared but never the specifics

Principal's report (Ross Jacobsen)	 * Rocks and rings (curling): rented equipment and started things up for teachers that are unfamiliar with floor curling (this week Schedule A, next week Schedule B) * Tennis: there's an opportunity to bring a tennis instructor that is following all covid protocol (up to 14 days, \$13 a student, 4 sessions per class 40 minutes per session). Fantastic program and have had experience in former school. Sessions will start right after spring break (April 6) * Covid protocol will most likely not change for this school year (including hot lunches which will most likely not be running this school year) * Dog poop: it's a lot better since the email was sent (only a couple incidents since last Thursday). * School was vandalized Sunday morning at 3:30am. All the teenagers involved were caught because of neighbours calling the cops. Unfortunately all kids except one are from Maple Ridge so we couldn't interview them. \$6000 in damage, and will take 6-8 weeks to fix the damages. Any chance you can drive by especially the back of the school after school hours will be much appreciated. Principal Report (Ross Jacobsen)	* We will have a design plan to guide costs, fundraising and expectations and overall vision. The plan is to have incremental builds for the outdoor play area since building everything at one time will be too expensive. * If you have feedback about what you would like to see for outdoor space, please email smillingcreekpac@gmail.com * Q: Will the new play structure installation fix the drainage issue? * Drainage shouldn't be an issue. Biggest issue now is kids have nowhere to play * Q: Will portables stay permanently? * That depends on capital project for the school extension to be approved before portables can be removed (usually 4-6 years) * Q: When will Sheffield Elementary be completed? * Possibly September 2022 but definitely not 2021 * Q: Have we considered a covered outdoor learning space? * We're looking into putting a roof over the exiting pergola but the process is taking a while. We can also consider adding sails that can provide partial shades. Or add vines for some additional shades * Q: Can we do an outdoor popcorn day? * Why not!
New Business (Damian Stanley)	 * We're still looking for Teacher Appreciation committee and spirit wear volunteers * We have almost hit the fundraiser target with what's budgeted, as we take on the outdoor play structure project. Here are some upcoming things planned to raise the funds needed: * Valentine's Day bouquets: Fran's Flower (Rhonda's company) has generously agreed to giving back a substantial kick back * Bottle Drive and family photos in the spring * Possibility of flower basket, Neufeld and/or gift cards for end of May * We were looking into doing something for Easter but didn't work out.
