RESP Info Larina Bouwman (Sun Life Financial) larina.bouwman@sun life.com	* Advisor at Sun Life for 10 years * RESP stands for Registered Education Savings Plan. Contributions are not tax deductible, but investment growth is tax sheltered. Investment growth portion of withdrawal is taxed in the child's hands. * RESP can be used for tuition, books, room and board, equipment and travel related to attendance. College, university, apprenticeship, CEGEP and trade school are all eligible. * There are three types of plans: * Individual plan (name one beneficiary) - doesn't have to be directly related to the beneficiary. For example grandparent can set one up for grandchild * Family plan (each applicant is related by blood or adoption). If one beneficiary does not use the grant, it can be transferred to another beneficiary * Group plan: contract to make regular contribution (and can be penalized if a contribution is missed) * CESG (Canada Education Savings Grant) is tax sheltered and gives you \$0.20 for every dollar contributed up to \$500 a year. * Child can use the fund until they're 21. Unused fund can be transferred to another beneficiary in a family plan. It can also be transferred to a personal RRSP account up to \$50,000, but the CESG must be repaid to the government (interest on CESG can be kept) * Slides will be attached

AGENDA ITEM Principal Update Ross Jacobsen	* Pink Shirt Day is tomorrow * There has been a few allegations of bullying at school, hence the email sent with the Rude vs. Mean vs. Bullying image. * Term 2 reports: Gradual transition students and parents are asked to prepare for a reverse child led teacher conference to showcase the work they have been doing at home. In person learners will have report card before spring break. * Report card format seems to be changed every year in this school district. Changes are coming from learning services department in the school district, but it seems to be making it harder for teachers to write the report card and harder for the principals to read them * Covid update: Fraser Health has made significant changes on how schools are updated about covid exposure. Previously the principal gets email notification from the superintendent, but now the principal will get notification directly from Fraser Health and have access to log in to see exposure dates and details. This should speed up notification to the families. * Fatigue and mental health from covid is evident from students, staff, parents. Frustration is up and patience is down. Be safe, be calm, be kind. There are more peer to peer conflicts, and seeing complaints that probably wouldn't have been voiced pre-covid time. * Kids have been very respectful of their play zones (they won't even go get a ball that has rolled to another play zone). Currently working on a plan to pair up learning group with another learning group to share outdoor play zones. Schedule B has an odd number of classes now which makes this a bit more challenging. * Year end assembly for grade 5 students: Current rule is that no parents can be a participant in the audience for any non-essential activity. If any grade 5 parents would like to join Ross to form a leaving committee to brainstorm what we can do for the grade 5 students that are within the health guidelines, please reach out to Ross. * Portable update: We are getting 4 portables. Unfortunately they can't teli tit into the sout
	* New Outdoor Natural Playground: Plans for rock benches along the west side of the school will have to hold off until portables are installed. Log climbers should be able to go in though since it is further away from the concrete path. Portable delivery date is not set but will be delivered by September 2021. * School supply feedback: Parents are encouraged to give feedback directly to Ross around shared school supplies (for grade K and 1) and the previous suppliers/supply list (for grade 2 - 5). If there is
	not a lot of feedback, the same supplies/suppliers will be used as the past year. * Garden update: Gardeners have come in to do some work but have not done much weeding yet

Outdoor Natural Playground Damian Stanley	* Habitat has given us an initial sketch of what the outdoor playground would look like. (Sketch will be attached) * Estimated cost: * Site prep: \$7600 * Wood fibre and boundary for log climber: \$9000 * 5 log climber: \$10,200 * Interpretive Forest: \$10,200 * \$37000 total (including tax) * We can do this in stages where we do site prep and log climber border first, then Habitat can come in to put in the equipment at a later date. PAC currently have about \$12,000 after all the planned fundraisers for the remainder of the year that can go towards the playground. * Reason for the higher site prep cost is because of the location of the site and how far it is from the road * Please send feedback around the proposed playground to us! * Heather has generously volunteered to help us look into applying for grants to cover some of the cost. If anyone else is interested to help please reach out to us.
Parking Map Ashley Pozzobon	* We've been working on a map to outline the best places to park (as well as where not to park) and best paths to walk to the school * Ross is working with the city to change the Soball parking signs back to 15 minutes parking instead of pickup/drop off only * The map will be sent out once we finalize parking signs with the city * Q: Are cross walk lights possible? A: Currently on the city of Coquitlam list (Soball and Princeton), but the city only funds a certain number of controlled intersections a year, but unsure what our priority is on that list. Parents are encouraged to reach out to the city and RCMP to advocate for the traffic light. * Q: Speed limit sign on Queenston? A: Queenston Ave is already 30km/h because of the park * Q: Can we get some guideline on who we should contact to advocate for the light? A: Please reach out to us and we can set something up
