- Almost all the teachers have used up their classroom funds.
- Most of the transportation field trip funds have been used.
- Gave out 20K for the rest of the tech upgrades and the river rocks on the west side.
- We had fundraisers, Neufeld (5K) and the plant sale (\$232). The movie night (\$1002) including ticket sales, food and concession - this was our community give back initiative provided as a donation to backpack buddies.
- On track to stay on budget this year, we are projecting 5K in profits for the year end BBQ.
- The budget will be sent out with the minutes. No changes have been made but if anyone has any questions or changes, please let Tanya know.
