Gr. 7 Volleyball –Tu Loan Trieu and Evan Cupit

Tu Loan say's, "We had another great season for grade 7 girls and boys triple-ball. We had 12 schoolss in the girls league and 9 schools for the boys league and we played for 5 weeks. The girls' play day ran smoothly and on time at Charles Best with much kudos to Dave Jones and his leadership crew. They reffed and score kept and it didn't cost us a penny. We had 20 teams participate with some schools entering 2 teams. That's about 180 screaming girls in one gym!

The boys played at Heritage and much thanks to Evan Cupit and his crew from Kwayhquitlam for arranging the tournament there as it was more work than the girls' tourney. Again, a smooth tournament with lots of play time for the 9 teams.

The only frustration that we had as coordinators was the number of teams that dropped after the schedule was set. It got very complicated to redo the schedule, especially with an odd number league. My recommendation is to take our time before schedules get drawn up. This may mean a 5 week season as opposed to a 6 week season.

We did not have a championship, which was decided earlier in the season. This made sense as triple-ball was a trial modification. We also did not have the minimum limits for players. We could have this discussion again next year?

From my experience, triple ball seemed to be well received by players and coaches. Some feedback from coaches:

"I did feel that I got to know the girls and other teams a bit better"

"Not 100% convinced it makes for better volleyball players yet, but am willing to give it a few years"

"It was great to have more interaction with the other coach and students"

"I liked triple ball for the fact that the students had a chance to touch the ball more often."

"I didn't like the fact that I was not able to be on the bench and coach the girls when they needed."

I did a survey with regards to whether they would like to see triple ball for next year. From the coaches who responded before 4pm on Monday, we had 8 YESs and 3 NOs."

## Report 5 From Paige Perry

#### Grade 8 Boys and Girls Volleyball Report

Thank you to all the coaches for volunteering their time in our volleyball season. After the initial meeting, it was decided that the Grade 8 would continue to play regular volleyball instead of Triple Ball. The season seemed to go smoothly even after Anders and I tried to make the league schedule with varying numbers of schools. This resulted in having some teams travel to other schools more often. Thank you to Banting, Monty, Eagle Mountain, Kway, Moody, Maillard, Citadel, and Summit for hosting the playoffs this year. Last year, the executive proposed a tentative budget that set aside some monies for volleyball. We used this money to pay for the high school referees and scorekeepers to a total of \$180 in gift cards for Charles Best Secondary and \$\_\_\_\_\_ for Port Moody Secondary. Congratulations to Scott Creek Grade 8 Boys A and B Congratulations to Minnekhada Grade 8 Girls A and to Maple Creek Grade 8 Girls B

Some of the concerns that were emailed for discussion:

The cost of having to pay for referees is becoming the new normal. Do we want to continue to use the high schools for the Districts or do we want to use middle schools so that we don't have to pay? The emphasis is to not pay for adult referees.

Some coaches were unaware of the 2014 decision to play with a no minimum number despite it being highlighted in our package at the beginning of the season.

Talking with some people-do we keep volleyball the same for the Grade 8s instead of moving towards Triple Ball.

Some of the rules seem to be changing all the time. How do we stay consistent i.e.) kicking the ball with our feet, tossing the ball and letting it drop on the serve, touching the tape and not the net, etc. A strong voice would like it to be known that we are in favour of no minimum number of players. Less pressure on coaches to chase player to make sure they don't get disqualified. It guarantees that small schools can play. It gives maximum playing time to teams with fewer players. It is not an unfair

advantage. Some people may be too concerned with the final outcome that more playing time. So perhaps they should create more teams for your school so that you players get more time. It may mean recruiting more coaches.

One person offered a GR8. VB recommendation: Only have a Grade 8 A Championship with a set number of players. Pull up Grade 7's to fill a team. 8, 10, 0r 12- no excuses for less players. Every school that submits a team must send a team to the A. There would be no B Championship- have B play night with 2 hosts, with no minimum numbers or maximum. All B team must be balanced as there is No winner of the tournament. No B final as this is now a FUN tournament. Everyone still gets a final tourney and it will help to eliminate the stacking complaint.
