Coquitlam Centre Emerging Artist Scholarship Award

The Coquitlam Center Emerging Artist scholarship is intended to assist a student graduating from a Coquitlam secondary school, who has been accepted to a post-secondary institution in visual arts and hopes to pursue a career in the visual arts. The scholarship will go to **one student from each secondary school participating in the Coquitlam Center Mall Student Art Exhibition (max. of 3 students/school can apply).** Criteria for granting of bursary are as follows:

In their application process students will include with their application:

- 1. A letter of reference from an Art teacher who can attest to their art experience
- 2. One paragraph outlining their interest in art and their career directions
- 3. Name tags taped to the right corner of each work
- 4. Art portfolio presented on the Scholarship board maximum of six works, to be submitted to their Art Teacher. The Art Teacher will submit paper applications on your behalf.
- 5. Students will assist in mounting their works (with other applicants) on a display board for the Coquitlam Centre Secondary Art Show (set-up and take down). Photos of 3D work are also permitted. Display boards from all schools will be located together for ease in judging.

Students must submit the Morguard-Coquitlam Center Scholarship application to their Art Teacher by the deadline indicated on the application.
