Sora – District E-book/Audiobook App



Our district has recently partnered up with Sora to bring e-books and audiobooks to students to read or listen to on their personal devices. Similar to apps like *Libby*, Sora allows students to borrow items 2 weeks at a time (1 week for certain genres such as graphic novels) to read on laptops (on a web browser) or mobile devices (through an app), using their district email and password. The system automatically detects students' grade level and only make suitable titles available. To access the program on a web browser, students can head to https://soraapp.com/library/sd43ca.
