Kirsten thanked EMM for their acceptance and for the team work together with parents and community

Andrew introduced incoming VP Misty Askew

- Misty shared she has been working with SD43 since 2000, she has children who have attended SD43 schools; she worked at Como Lake Middle School for 4 years, Scott Creek Middle School for 17 years, Minnehada Middle School for 3 years
- She loves working with adolescents, supporting leadership, excited to work in Thunderbird community, feel free to reach out

Andrew thanked Kirsten for helping him learn about EMM, and wishes her well for her time at Minnehada; welcome to Misty, looking forward to working together

EMM 10-year Anniversary

- Legacy – name on outside of building

- Music program – Sharon Ipe wants to involve choir and band; possibly past students
- Powerpoint to show students past and present
- Katie suggests PAC can budget for a contribution – for further discussion
- Andrew is meeting with artist next week to create a mural for the gym, possible to unveil at event to celebrate 10 years; potential for PAC to contribute to this
- Kirsten reminds of desire for sign at entry by the outdoor classrooms “EMM property”; parent suggests district environmental learning staff could help/advise with sign

Kirsten:

- basketball up and running
- table board games after school Wednesdays
- sign language club running
- rainbow pride club running at lunch
- drama club has asked if HWSS students would facilitate over lunch so kids can put on a play
- Black history month
 - o black excellence day yesterday
 - o staff put a call out to black students to talk about how school can do better, teach better; 3 students volunteered to give feedback - they think what school is already doing is good and keep moving in that direction; students have empathy for others learning, all on a learning journey
 - o The “n” word – need to teach kids about that word and why they shouldn’t use it
 - o Parent expressed appreciation for staff having these conversations
 - o staff want to create cultural group and to create classroom opportunity for kids to identify who they are and share with each other

Andrew:

- thank you to Jane for all her work on Winter Market activity – a wonderful experience
- enrollment going down next year by about 20-25 students 170 each grade level, 150-155 grade 6’s coming in; trend with lower enrollment each year
- Parent question about portables, Andrew hopes to get rid of them

5. Treasurer’s Report – Steph

- Gaming grant = \$10,940 (based on student population), budget similar to last year
- Operating budget = \$13,661
- Winter Market \$14,000 revenue; expenses \$5,967 (Yah Jane!) Profit \$8,000
- Munchalunch revenue projections reduced because of late start
- \$11,000 - last year’s parent donations to gr. 8 leaving
- Katie suggests one call for donations with both ceremony and celebration event; if event is after hours, Andrew suggests separating the donation request as not all students will attend events outside of school hours
