Registration for the 2025-26 School Year

Middle School

In December week a letter was sent home with each Grade 5 student with information about their catchment Middle School. If the school mentioned in the letter is the school you wish your child to attend, no further action is needed from you. If it is not, please follow the instructions in the letter, apply for cross catchment, or see the instructions below to apply for a "Program of Choice".

Kindergarten Registration - February 4th - 6th

If your child was born in 2020 it is time to register for Kindergarten!!


An online registration form will be posted on the Alderson and the District websites for parents to fill out. **Please ensure that you apply at your child's catchment school** (you can check this on the **school locator**). School secretaries will be using this school locator to verify that each applicant is in our school catchment. Please be sure to read all of the information and follow the instructions regarding the required documentation for registration.

New kindergarten students who have an older sibling at Alderson are considered "in catchment" even if their address is out of our catchment area. You can apply directly to Alderson without going through the cross-catchment process. Only those students who are five years of age on or before December 31, 2025 can be accepted for September 2025 enrollment.

Cross Catchment Process - February 7th to 12th
